Wood's Tea Co. to play at Chicory House

Pulling from a cache of over a dozen instruments, the Wood's Tea Company bring their lively blend of Irish, bluegrass and folk music to the Chicory House May 10.

The non-profit, volunteer-run Chicory House, northeastern Pennsylvania's only venue dedicated to presenting folk music and dance, holds its coffeehouse-style concerts in the community room of St. Stephen's Church, 35 South Franklin Street in Wilkes-Barre.

The Chicory House is not affiliated with St. Stephen's.

The New England based Wood's Tea Company, features Rusty Jacobs on pennywhistle, guitar, bodhran and digital horn; Mike Lussen on five-string guitar, banjo and bodhran; and Tom MacKenzie on five-string banjo, guitar and hammered dulcimer.

The trio brings an energy and enthusiasm to its eclectic style which conjures up a cross between the Kingston Trio and the

Clancey Brothers, with a touch of Simon and Garfunkel. Although the band, popular at Irish festivals throughout the nation, delves largely into its repertoire of Celtic tunes, it also blends in bluegrass, sea ballads and some dry contrarian humor.
