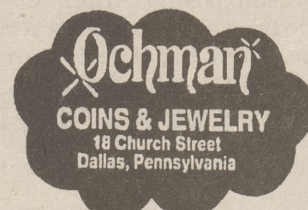
Fran Ochman has operated a jewelry and coin business in Dallas since 1979, and has advertised in The Dallas Post since the store opened.
