O'Reilly's prom king and queen

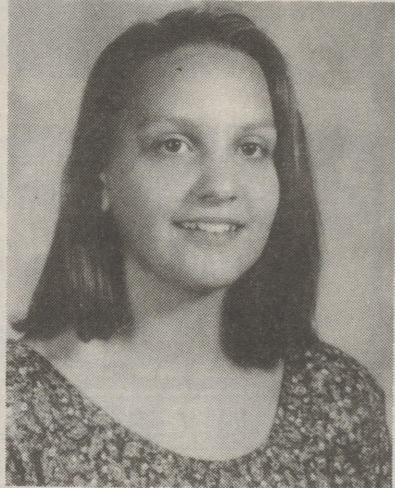

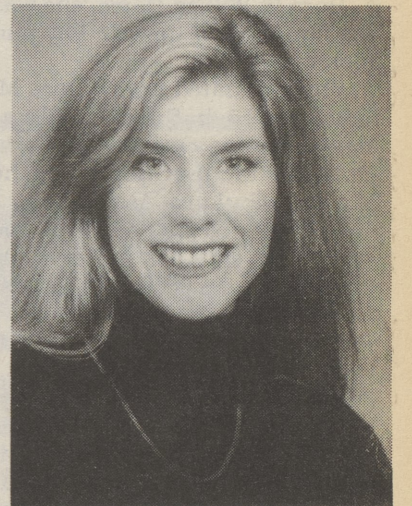
Maura Mundy earns degree from Widener Law School
