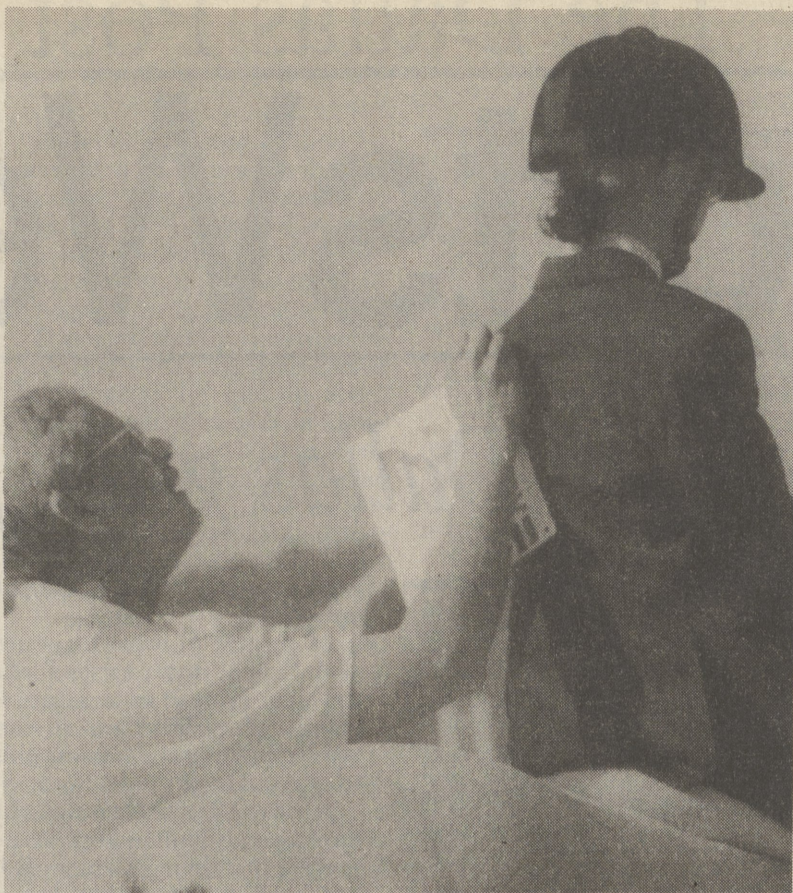

The first NasCUP soccer classic took place in May 1987 at Wyoming Valley West Stadium when the West team defeated the

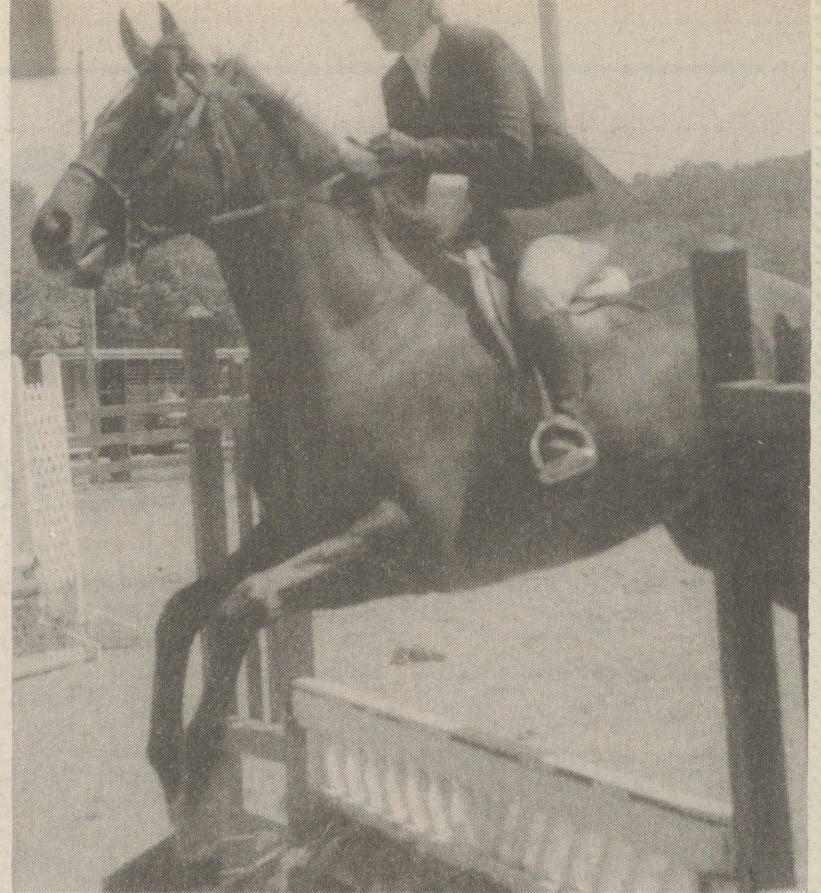
East team, 4-1. All former NasCUP players who played in any of the nine previous events are invited to attend this year's game when their alumni status will be recognized by the committee arranging the games.
