The Phillies, Amanda Stolarick pitched for her team and went three for four at the bat.

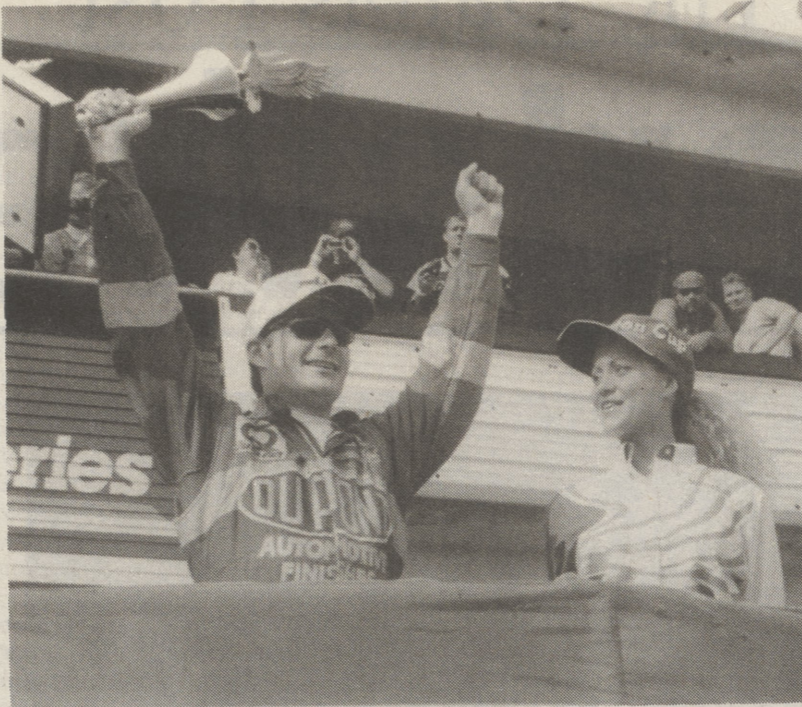
AAA - Baseball

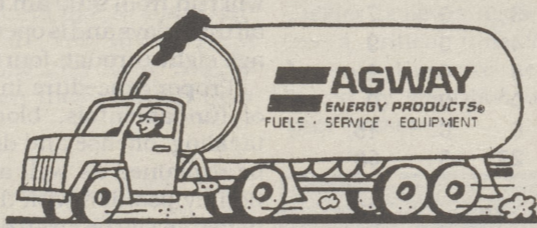
