O'Reilly High School, where she is active in many school activities and serves as the sophomore class secretary.

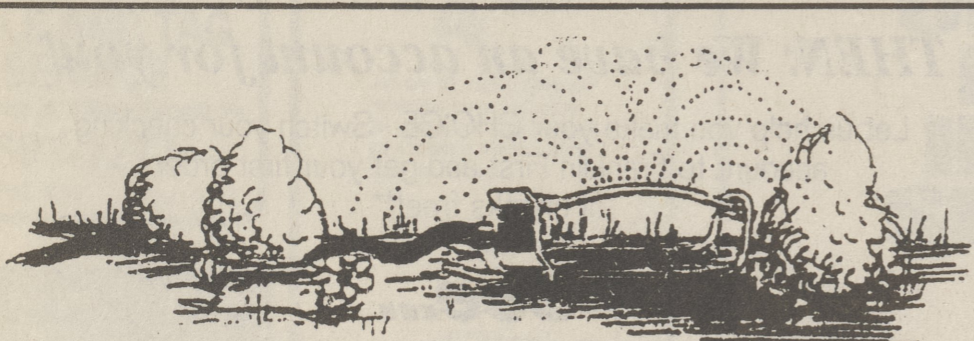
Dr. Zalatimo Opens Satellite Office in Dallas
