MONDAY - Barbecue rib patty, tater tots, corn cobettes, tomato juice, chilled peaches, sandwich roll, ketchup.

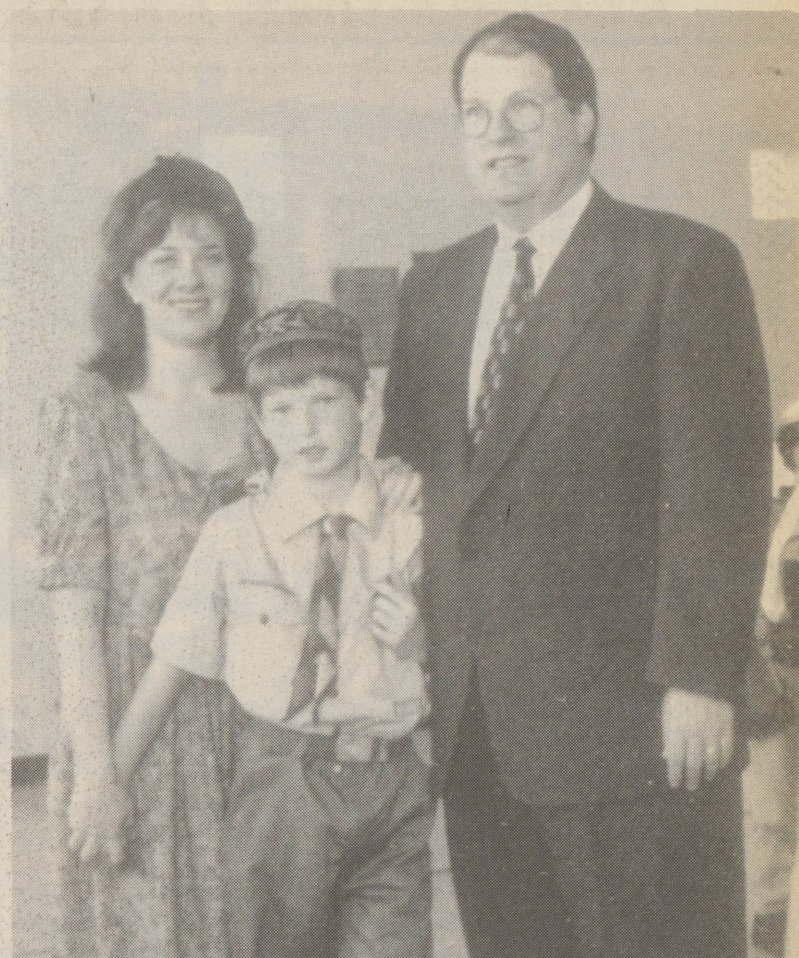
TUESDAY - Grilled chicken, rice pilaf, carrots w/dill, cantaloupe, whole wheat dinner roll.
