#### Korean War Vets to hold ceremony July 27

The Korean War Veterans Association of Wyoming Valley will commemorate the 43rd anniversary of the cease-fire in Korea at a ceremony July 27, at 10 a.m. on the south lawn of the Luzerne County Courthouse, in Wilkes-Barre. During the Korean War, 139 men from the greater Wyoming Valley lost their lives, while the federalized 109th FA suffered 33 fatalities in the tragic Coshocton, Ohio, train wreck.

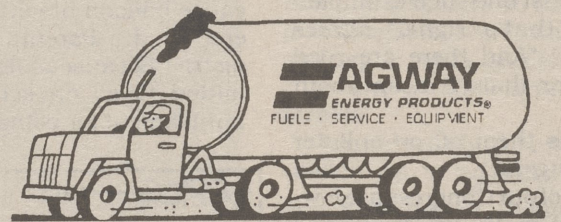
