These two veteran Air Show performers joined forces in 1992. Dave

Dacy, with 22 years of flying and Johnny Kazian, 33 years of wingwalking, will bring an unforgettable spectacle to the skies of Armed Forces Air Show '96, combining their talents on Dacy's Super Stearman bi-wing aircraft, which sports a checkerboard paint

style reminiscent of the old air show era.

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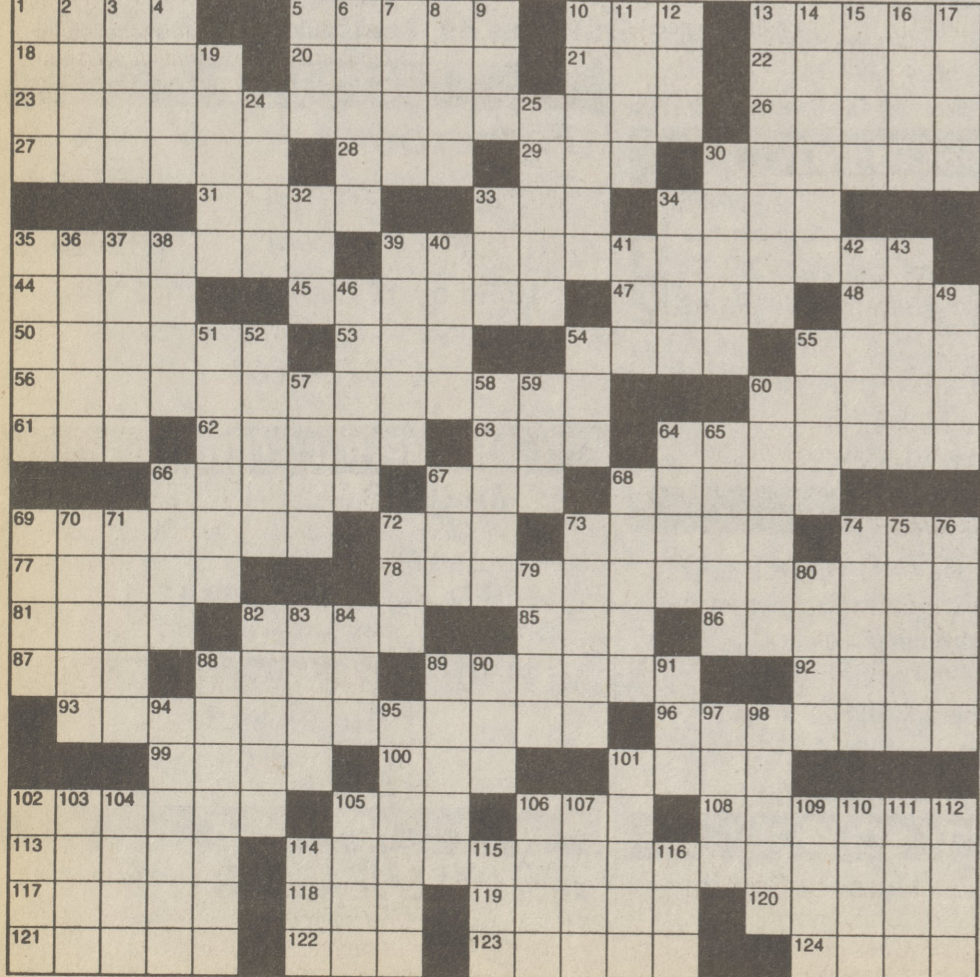
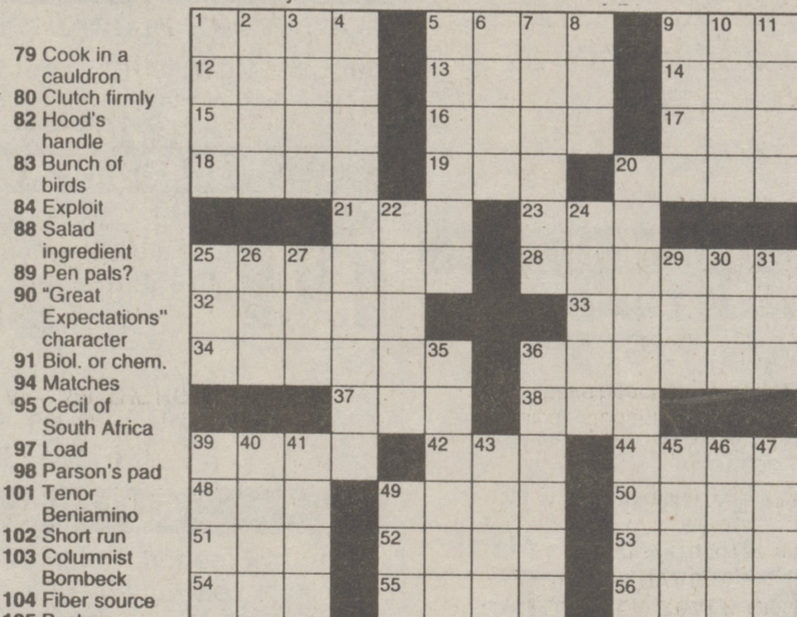
