"Ricketts Days/A Celebration" will be highlighted by many exciting events and programs the weekend of Aug. 2-4.

The festivities will begin August 2 at 9:30 a.m. at Pavilion I at the Lake Jean Beach Area with an official welcome by Park Manager Terry Daltroff.

"Indian Lore and Artifacts," "History of Ricketts," "The Lumbering, Tanning and Iceing Era," "Sullivan County/Turn of the Century," "Backpacking and the Loyalsock Trail," "Central Lumbering" are just a few of the interesting and educational topics to be discussed by featured speakers.

Exhibits by the Pennsylvania Game Commission, Fish and Boat Commission and the Bureau of Forestry will be on display.

Special historic exhibits will be presented by the Sullivan County and Wilkes-Barre historical societies.

Nature walks include "Ramblings at Ricketts," "Falls Trail-Ganoga Glen," and "The Ghost Town of Ricketts."

Evening programs include "The History of Lopez-Lumbering and Mining Era" and the "Ghost Towns of Ricketts, Stull and Noxen."
