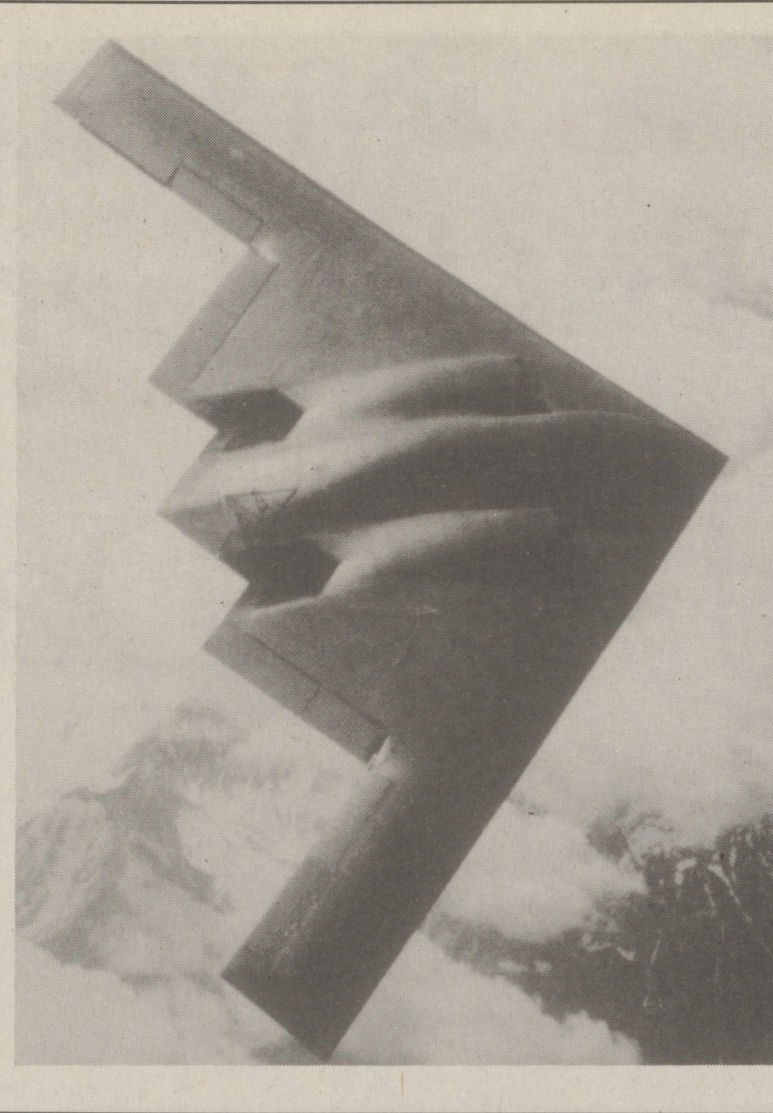

B-2A bomber will fly over

Barry Centini, Airport / Air Show Director, announced confirmation from the Department of Defense for a flyover of the B-2A "Spirit" Stealth Bomber as a part of Armed Forces Air Show '96 to be held on Aug. 17 and 18 at the airport. The exact time for the flyover appearances will be announced closer to the Air Show dates, but it will consist of multiple low level passes over the airport and the Luzerne and Lackawanna community.

With four jet engines mounted on top and a two man crew, it has an unrefueled range of 6,300 miles.

Parking for the air show is provided at expanded air show parking lots. Free remote parking is provided at Rocky Glen Park at Exit 50 and at the Lackawanna County Multi-Purpose Stadium at Exit 51. Free shuttle bus service is provided directly to and from Air Show gates, which open at 9 a.m. and close at 6 p.m. both days. Tickets will be sold only at the entrance gates and cost \$9.00 for adults, \$4.00 for children ages six through 12, and children under age six are admitted free when accompanied by an adult.

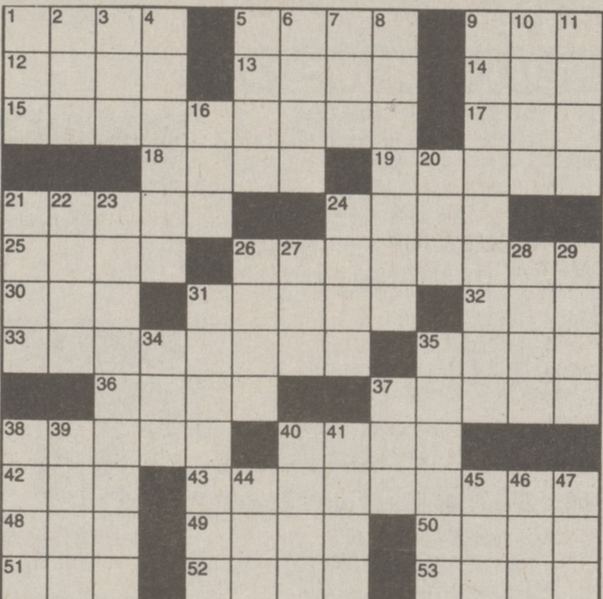
