



Police hold golf tournament

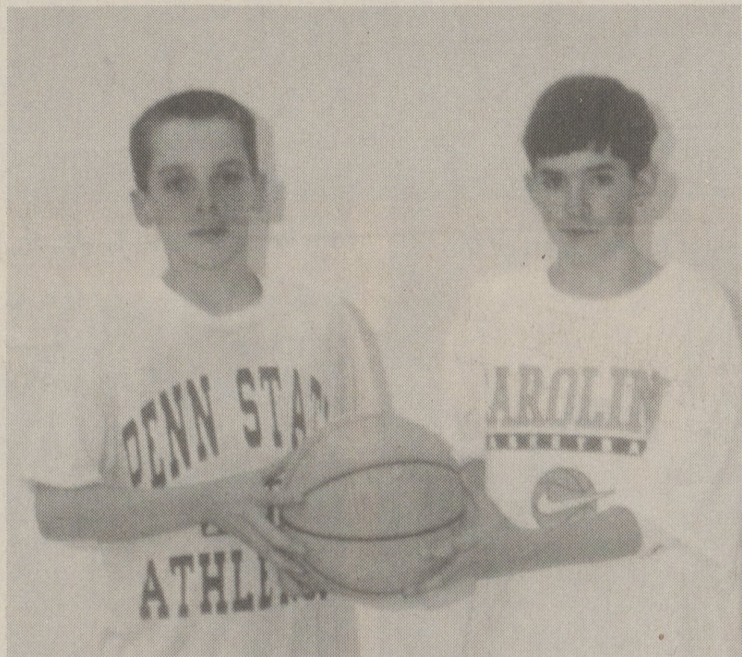

Bike club slates Great 100 ride Aug. 24

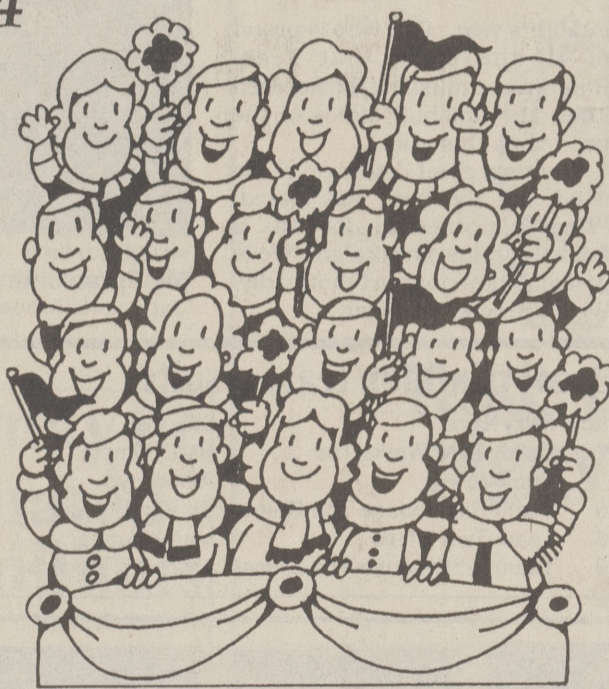
