Antique propeller stolen from municipal building

HARVEYS LAKE - A large cast-iron steamboat propeller was stolen last weekend, between Friday night and noon Tuesday, from the grounds of the muncipal building.

Believed to be the propeller from the Natoma, the lake's largest steamboat, it weighs several hundred pounds and requires "two very strong men" to lift it, according to Harveys Lake Protective Association president Guy Giordano.

"It's cast iron and three feet in diameter," he said. "It has four blades and is rust-colored - we stripped the paint from it."

The association planned to incorporate the propeller into a monument at the triangular grassy area at the Sunset section of the lake.
