Metz began his food service management career in 1967 with the Custom Management Corporation.

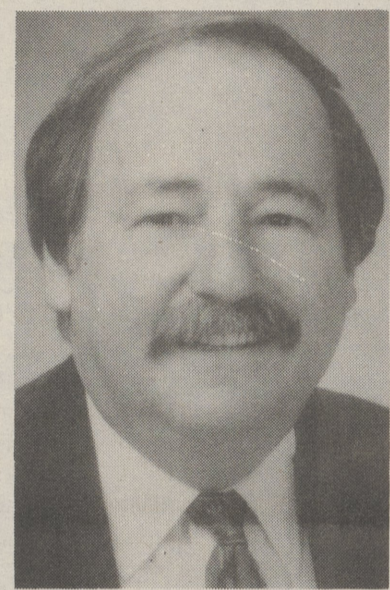
In 1987, Custom Management Corporation was acquired by Morrison's Hospitality Group, and Metz was named chairman and CEO of Morrison's Custom Management.
