Call 288-1023 between 7:30 a.m. and noon. Meals on Wheels delivers a cooked meal and a light evening snack to the elderly, five days a week.

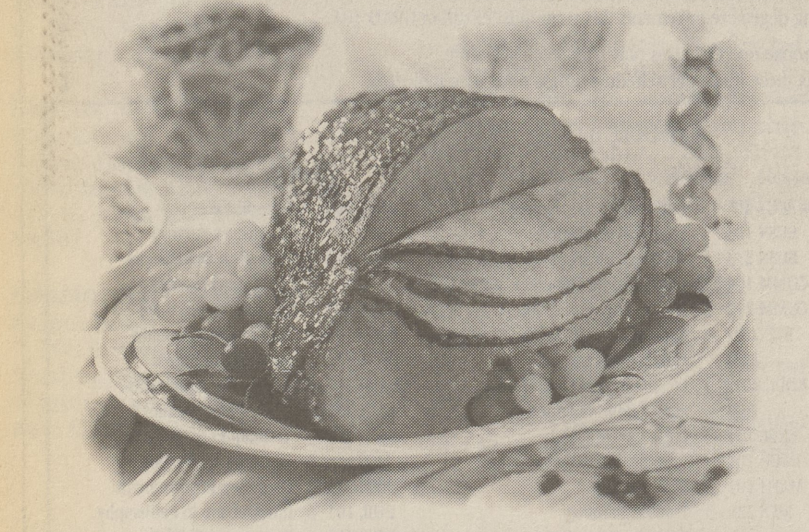
Boro office closed Labor Day
