The Dallas Borough Council will read and entertain a motion to pass the following Ordinance at the next regularly scheduled Council meeting to be held on Tuesday, September 17, 1996, at 8:30 P.M. at the Borough Building, 25 Main Street, Dallas, PA.

An Ordinance prohibiting the use of skateboards upon public streets, sidewalks and walkways and alleys of the Borough of Dallas.

It is and shall be unlawful for any person or persons to use, ride, propel or otherwise operate a skateboard on the public streets, alleys, public sidewalks, and walkways located within the Borough of Dallas.

SECTION 2 - PENALTIES

Any person who shall violate the provisions of this Ordinance shall be subject to the following penal-

(a) First Offense - The skateboard used in violation of this Ordinance shall be impounded by the Police Department of the Borough of Dallas for a period not exceeding fifteen (15) days. If the person violating this Ordinance is a minor, in addition to the confiscation of the skateboard as aforementioned, the Borough Police shall notify the parents, guardian, or other person having legal custody of said minor of the violation of this Ordinance and the impounding of the skateboard, and shall provide such individual with a copy of this Ordinance.

(b) Second and/or Subsequent Offenses - The skateboard of any person violating the provisions of this Ordinance for the second and/or subsequent time shall be impounded by the Police Department of the Borough of Dallas for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days, and said person shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than Fifteen (\$15.00) Dollars and not more than Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars, and costs. In the event said person is a minor, the parent, guardian, or other person having legal custody of said minor shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of not less than Fifteen (\$15.00) Dollars and not more than Three Hundred (\$300.00) Dollars, and costs.

A complete copy of this Ordinance is on file in the Dallas Post and the Borough's Office for review by any interested party or parties during regular business hours.

This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon its adoption.


