**Misericordia Choral Society seeks singers**

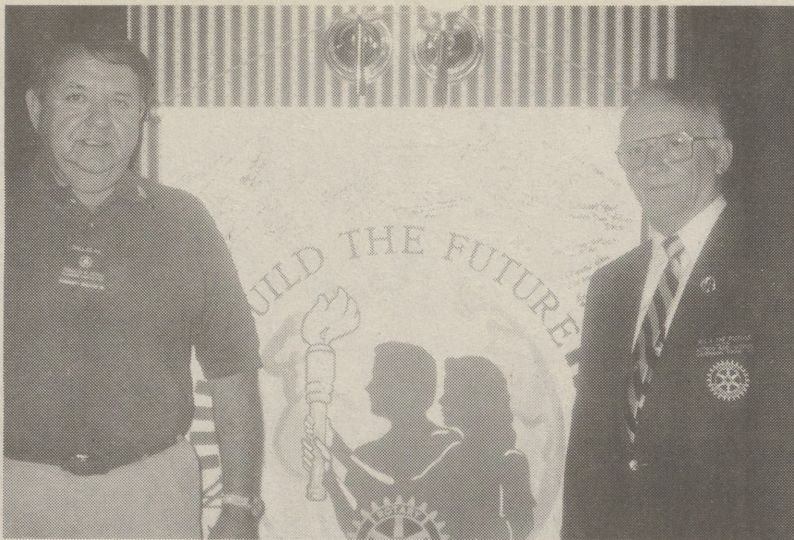

**Healey appointed clinic director**

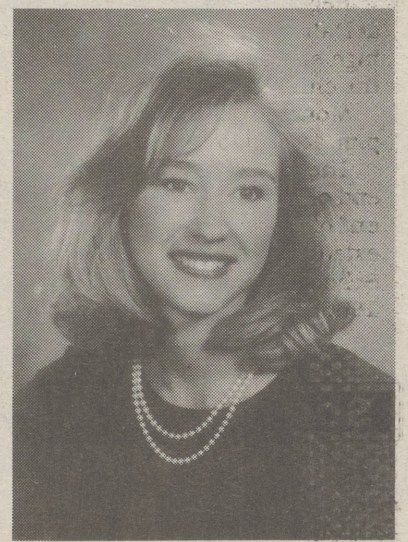
