The second annual Airport Day at historic Wyoming Valley Airport will be held September 29, noon to 5 p.m. on the vast airport complex at Forty Fort.

Experience aviation's past and present as aviation history comes to life with a Douglas DC-3; 2/3 Scale P-51 Mustang; 2/3 Scale Hawker Hurricane; Cessna UC-78 "Bamboo Bomber" and other vintage and classic airplanes.

The first air-carrier passenger service out of the area originated from the local port with the flying of the Douglas DC-3, operated by American Airlines.

The airport, whose inception

dates back to circa 1910, was incorporated in 1929.

The Wyoming Valley Airport was a training site for the Army Air Corps during World War II.

In the years since, the three-letter airport identifier (WBW), signifying Wilkes-Barre/Wyoming Valley, has become a mainstay with thousands of aviators both near and far. The airport's historic main hanger still stands today.

Admission is free to the airport grounds. Refreshments will be available for purchase at nominal fees and a gigantic arts and crafts show/sale will be held near the main hanger.
