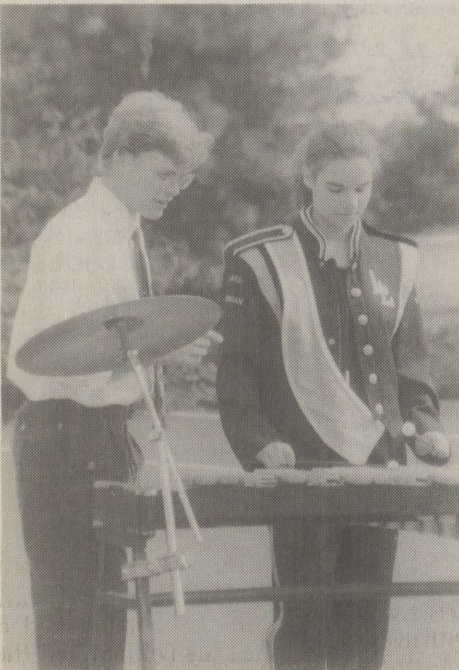




## STRIKE UP THE BANDS

of roads for the system. "It's tremendous amount of work. The municipalities are coordinating some of it with their fire chiefs."

Kingston Township hasn't checked its list of roads yet, but "it's something we'll have to look at," according to manager Jeff Box.

The post office has already given homes in many rural areas city-style addresses, according to customer service supervisor Charles Innamorati in Dallas, but some roads use house numbers on one end and box numbers on the other.

"We're working on this with the municipalities," he said. "Municipal Road in Franklin Township is a good example - half of it is still

box numbers."

Maple, Oak and Elm are popular area street names - Maple Street is found in Trucksville (Kingston Township), Chase (Jackson Township), Fern Brook (Dallas Township), Oak Hill (Lehman Township) and Laketon and Alderson (both in Harveys Lake).

The Back Mountain also boasts four Sunset Roads, two Roushey Streets and a plethora of similar-sounding names - Wood Street, Woodcliff Drive, Woodbine Road, Woodlawn Ave., Woodlawn Drive, Woodside Drive and Woodtip Drive are good examples.

They made repeated forays into the home between 11 a.m. and 1 p.m., first taking two half-gallon bottles of liquor - a bottle of Jim Beam and a bottle of vodka - along with a 12-pack of Diet Coke and six Reese's peanut butter cups, whose wrappers police recovered for evidence.

The suspects reportedly took items worth a total of \$1,000, which included \$150 in change, baseball cards with an estimated value of \$50, a man's gold wedding ring worth about \$500, a Polaroid 35 mm camera worth \$75, a man's gold ring set with black onyx and diamond chips worth about \$150 and a sterling silver chain valued at \$90.

The suspect who had the silver chain and the onyx ring later threw them into the woods so he wouldn't be caught with them, Dennis said.

They also took a Jennings .25-

caliber semiautomatic handgun and two full seven-round clips and two boxes containing 100 rounds of .22 caliber ammo, which Sabulski helped them trade for a small amount of marijuana in Wilkes-Barre, police said.

The youth who received the gun was later caught carrying it loaded. When police recovered it, nine rounds had been shot, Dennis said.

"The juveniles skipped school to commit both crimes," Dennis said. "We're spreading the word that we have a zero tolerance policy for both juvenile and adult crimes. We will pursue every lead and investigate every crime until an arrest is made."

He also cautioned residents to keep their outside lights on at night and lock their doors and windows whenever they leave home.

**MONDAY** - Baked meatloaf, oven brown potatoes, vegetable medley, whole wheat bread, rice pudding.

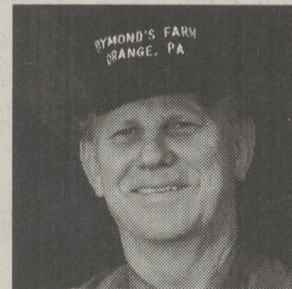
**TUESDAY** - Pork chop w/stuffing-gravy, sweet potatoes, Harvard beets, raisin bread, orange.

**WEDNESDAY** - Liver and onions, whipped potatoes, green beans/mushrooms, whole wheat bread, Oreos.

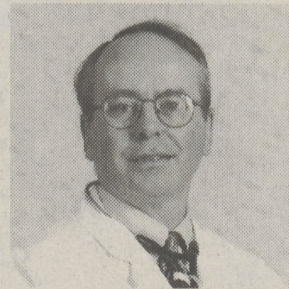
