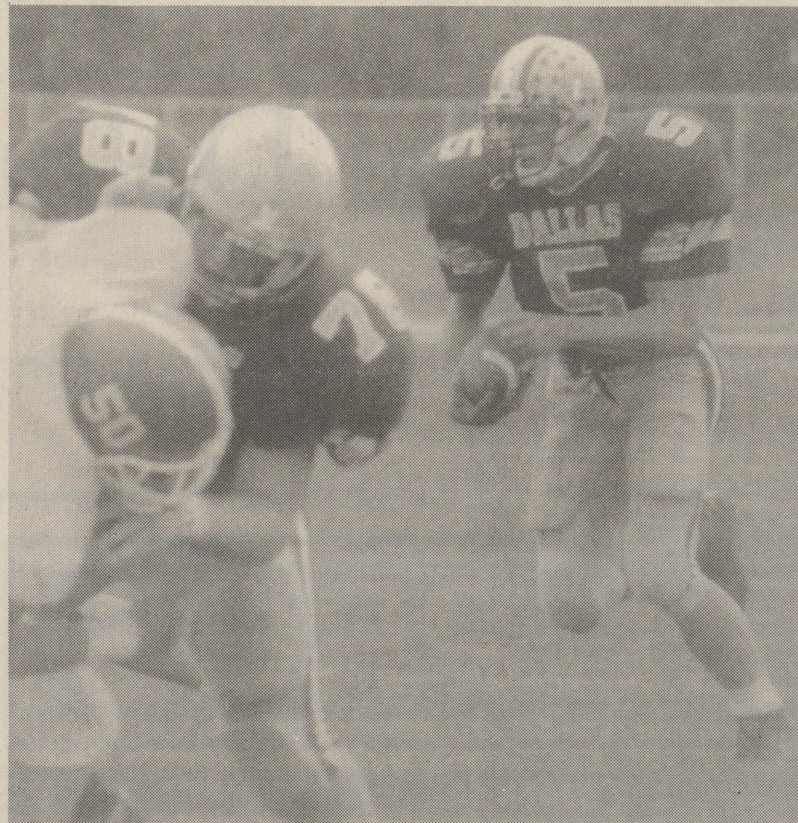


SATURDAY AFTERNOON ROMP

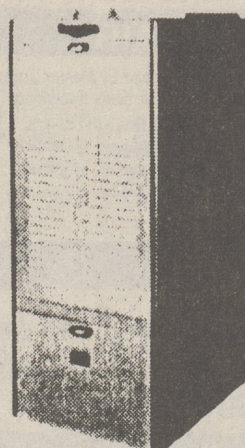
