

Carverton Rd. to be one way

TRUCKSVILLE - Carverton Road will become one way to the east beginning Nov. 13, so that repairs can be made to the bridge that spans Toby's Creek. Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) spokesperson Pat Maguschak said formal detours for cars and trucks will be in effect until mid-December, then lifted until spring before being reinstated to June.

Cars approaching Rt. 309 on Carverton Rd. will be re-routed up Oak St. to Harris Hill Rd. Trucks will have a much longer detour: out to 8th St., up to Mt. Olive Rd. and then along Hildebrandt Rd. to Rt. 309 in Dallas Township. Traffic off Rt. 309 onto Carverton will not be affected.

Maguschak pointed out that traffic will be allowed to all businesses and the Kingston Township municipal offices throughout the construction period.

DISTRICT COURT BRIEFS

Pair face burglary charges

John George Appel IV, 21, of 63 Joseph St., Dallas and Dennis D. Stepney, 22, 456 No. Main St., Wilkes-Barre, were charged by Dallas Borough police with burglary and criminal trespass in connection with a theft Oct. 25 at the Garvey residence at 76 Highland Blvd., Dallas. Appel also was charged with criminal conspiracy, theft and unauthorized use of an automobile.

The investigation began after Dennis Garvey's employer received a phone call from Kaufman's Department Store at the Wyoming Valley Mall saying someone had attempted to use Garvey's store charge card without other identification. Garvey was contacted in Arizona where he was traveling on business and told his employer the credit card should have been in his dresser at home.

Dallas Borough officer Russell Devens reported he went to the home shortly after noon Oct. 25 to

check for signs of forced entry and was greeted by Garvey's daughter, Kaitlyn, who said she had stopped over to let a dog out. Garvey called while Devens was there, and asked Kaitlyn Garvey to check to see if his credit cards were missing. She found they were, along with jewelry and other items.

When police at the Wyoming Valley Mall searched Stepney they found credit cards, four rings, some with Garvey's name inscribed on them, and a small quantity of cash.

After the Garveys returned from Arizona, they provided a list of several items that were missing, including six guns, jewelry and cash valued at over \$13,000. The items had apparently been taken sometime during the early morning hours of Oct. 25 after the defendants and other individuals had been in the home at an all-night party.
