Q. My kids are still growing. Should I buy or rent skis?

A: If your kids only ski five or six times a year you should probably rent. For kids who ski more frequently owning is better because they will have better equipment and as they grow their equipment can be traded in, but usually kids keep their skis for two years. Some kids get two years from their boots, but be careful not to get boots too big, they need good ankle support. For families on a budget we have a used equipment section.
