Here are six basic steps involved in applying for financial

Decide which forms you need to complete. As a minimum, you will have to complete the Free Appliction for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The 1997-98 FAFSA will be sent by mail to students who have taken college boards by mid-December. The Guidance Office also has these forms.

2. Know your deadlines. 3. Schools may require the Profile Form. If so, these registration materials are available at the Guidance Office or students can register by phone at 1-800-778-

4. Decide if you can get your taxes done in time to complete the FAFSA Form. If not, it is okay to provide estimated figures.

5. Gather together all your financial records (FAFSA and Profile will tell you what you will need) and complete all the necessary forms by the deadlines. Colleges assume that it is your responsibility to make sure you complete all required forms by the deadlines.

6. Attend Financial Aid Night at the High School on Jan. 8, at 7 p.m. Peggy Charnick, Financial Aid Expert from College Misericordia will help you through the financial aid process.

Seniors having trouble with your college essays? Stop in at the Guidance Office for help from the Princeton Review on this important step in applying to a col-
