Wyoming Sem honors Morgan for service

Wyoming Seminary's highest honor - the Distinguished Service Award was presented to four members of the school community on Nov. 8.

Wyoming Seminary Day School teacher Margaret Morgan of Dallas, will be among those honored at the annual recognition dinner.

Morgan began her teaching career at what was then the Wilkes-Barre Day School in 1942. Following the merger of the Wilkes-Barre Day School merged with Wyoming Seminary in 1951, Morgan continued teaching at Wyoming Seminary Day School throughout the 1950s. A graduate of Mansfield University and the University of Pennsylvania, Morgan was an inspired teacher who played a vital role in the lives of generations of students. Her English, French and ancient history classes are still remembered warmly by her students.

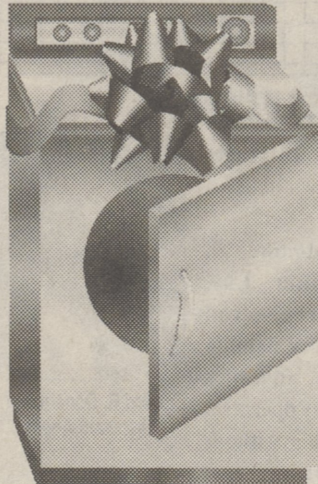
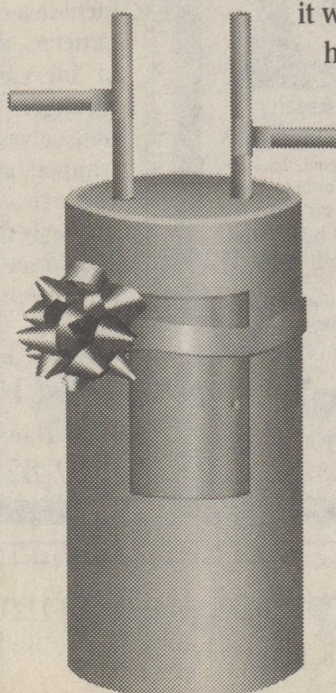

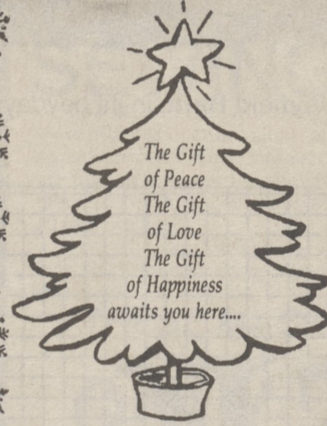
