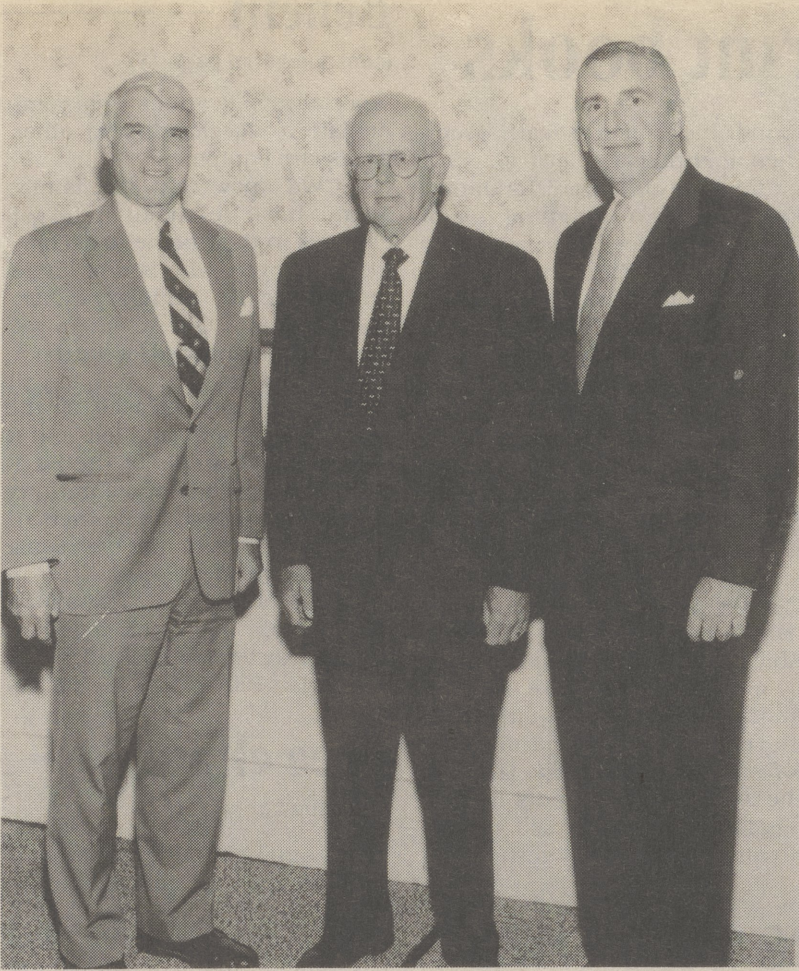

Frank Henry honored with Buckingham Award

For his years of exemplary service to Wyoming Seminary, Frank M. Henry of Dallas was honored with the school's Harold C. Buckingham Award for Outstanding Service. Established in 1993 to honor the memory of Buckingham, eighth president of Wyoming Seminary, the award was presented to Henry at a dinner in his honor.

"With an eye for the future, a sensitive feeling for the heritage of the past and a regard for the realities of the present, Frank Henry continues to effectively serve Wyoming Seminary in the finest tradition of alumni and trustee leadership," said board chairman George B. Sordoni in presenting the Buckingham Award.

A 1950 graduate of Wyoming Seminary, Henry was elected to the board of trustees in 1967 and served as chairman of the board from 1973 to 1979. He began his tenure as board chairman under dramatic circumstances: just the year before, flooding caused by Hurricane Agnes devastated the school, wrecking \$6.5 million in damages. As board chairman

during the post-flood period, Henry led the school through its rebuilding and restoring years, placing it in a position of strength for the 21st century.

He has served with distinction on every board committee, and in 1989-90 chaired the presidential search committee that brought H. Jeremy Packard to campus as Wyoming Seminary's 10th president. Most recently, Henry was the national chairperson of Wyoming Seminary's 150th Anniversary Capital Campaign. Through his leadership, energy and enthusiasm, the capital campaign has raised \$20 million to date—66 percent over its initial goal of \$12 million.

President of the Frank Martz Coach Company, Wilkes-Barre, Henry is an active community leader throughout the region, serving as the chairman of the Board of Directors of the Geisinger Foundation. He is a member and past chairman of the Board of Trustees of Wilkes University, the Salvation Army and the YMCA. He and his wife, Dorothea, have three children, all of whom are Wyoming Seminary graduates.
