The Hayfield Society is an informal association of individuals and corporate representatives who make an annual contribution of

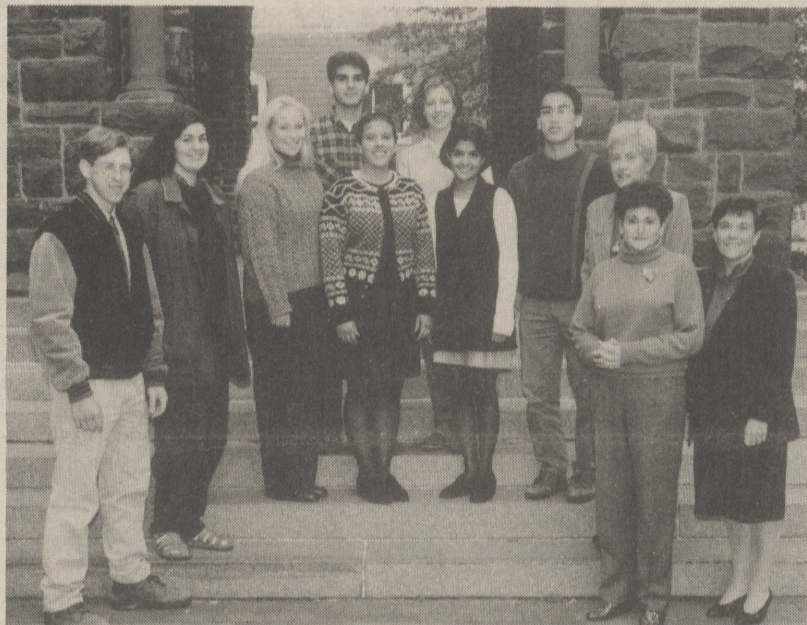
