HEAT 51 - SIXERS 45



#### State stocks 3,500 pheasant

By Christmas Eve some 3,500 pheasant hens will have been released on lands open to the public hunting in Northeastern Pennsylvania. Release locations will primarily be on State Game Lands, Forest-Game, Farm-Game and Safety Zone cooperator's property. Pheasants (males and females north of I-80), squirrels, and grouse may be hunted Dec. 26 through Jan. 25. Snowshoe Hares are open from Dec. 26 until Jan. 1 and Cottontails may be hunted between Dec. 26 and Feb. 8. Hunters should consult their current Hunting

and Trapping Digest for daily limits and a summary of hunting regulations.
