Pender is the son of Barbara and stepson of Ernst Higgins of Dallas.

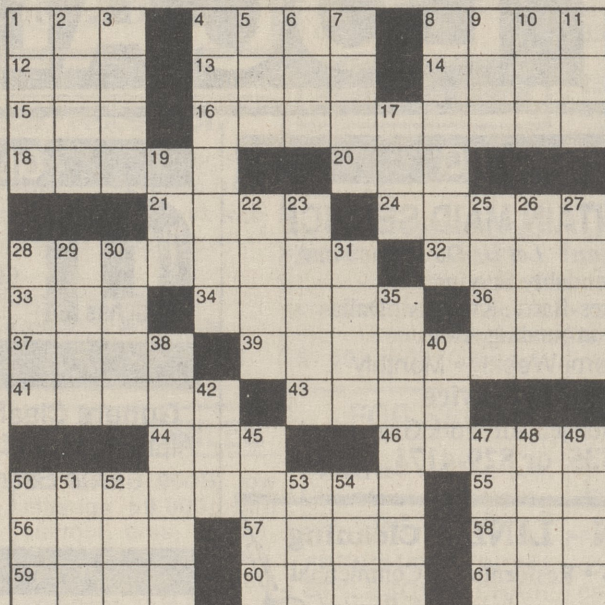
