Notice is hereby given that George Bone Construction Company, 98 New Street, Pittston, Pa. 18640 is making application to the Department of Environmental Protection, Bureau of Mining and Reclamation, Pottsville District Office, for renewal of an Anthracite Bank Removal and Reclamation Surface Mining Permit, to discharge treated surface runoff to the Susquehanna River from an operation located in Hughestown Borough, Luzerne County, Pennsylvania. The current permit 40910202, was issued on 2/11/91 and will expire on 2/11/97. This renewal does not contain revisions to the existing operation. The Permit Area is more specifically located as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of the northerly right-of-way line of Parsonage Street (S.R. 2032) and the easterly right-of-way line of New Street. 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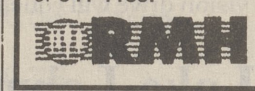
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
