Lehman tax bills sent Feb. 1

According to Lehman Township tax collector Peggy Moyer, the 1997 County/Municipal Real Estate, Township Per Capita, and Street Lights tax bills have been issued Feb. 1st.

All bills have been mailed to the property owner and/or resident, at their last known address.

Anyone not receiving their bills, or have recently sold their property, should notify the tax collector.

Those taxpayers who have an escrow account should promptly forward their Real Estate tax bills on to their bank or mortgaging

company for payment. Per Capita and Street Light bills are to be paid by the individual themselves. All residents 18 years of age and older are liable for the per capita tax. If you did not receive a tax bill, contact the tax collector.

All 1997 bills are currently due at the rebate value through April 1. Anyone mailing in their taxes and would like a receipt, should enclose a self-addressed stamped envelope.

Office hours are Tuesdays and Wednesdays, from 10 a.m.-5 p.m. and the last three days of rebate, March 29, 31 and April 1.

The following menu is for the week of March 3. All meals include margarine, milk and coffee.

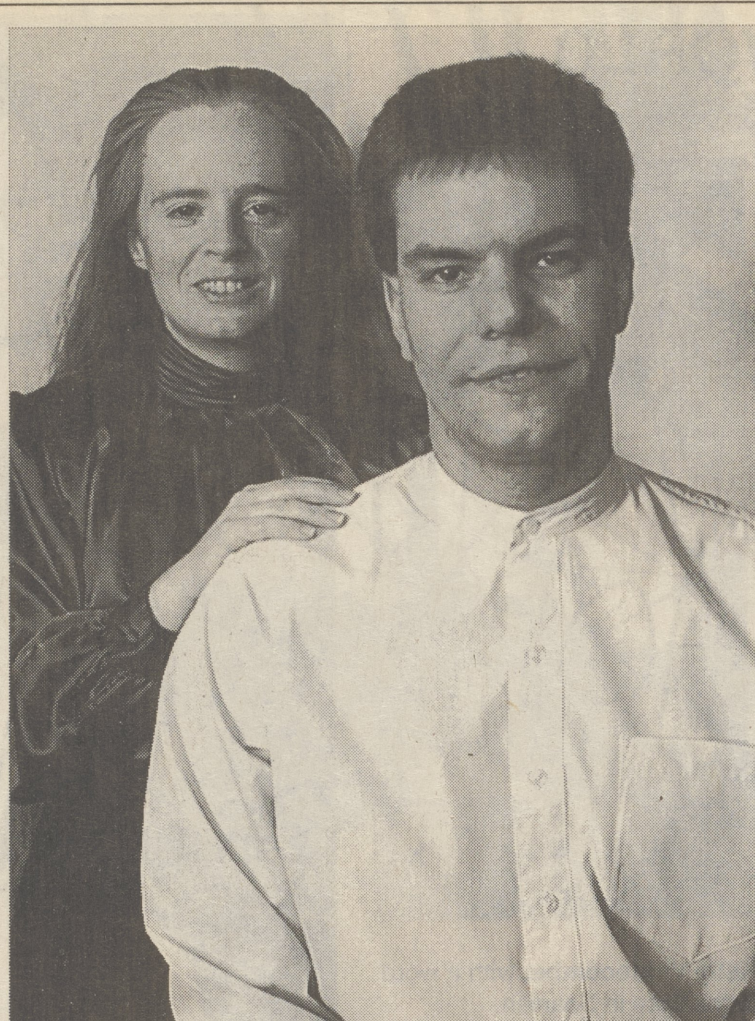
MONDAY - Beef braciola w/ gravy, whipped potatoes, vegetable medley, whole wheat bread, chilled pineapple w/coconut.
