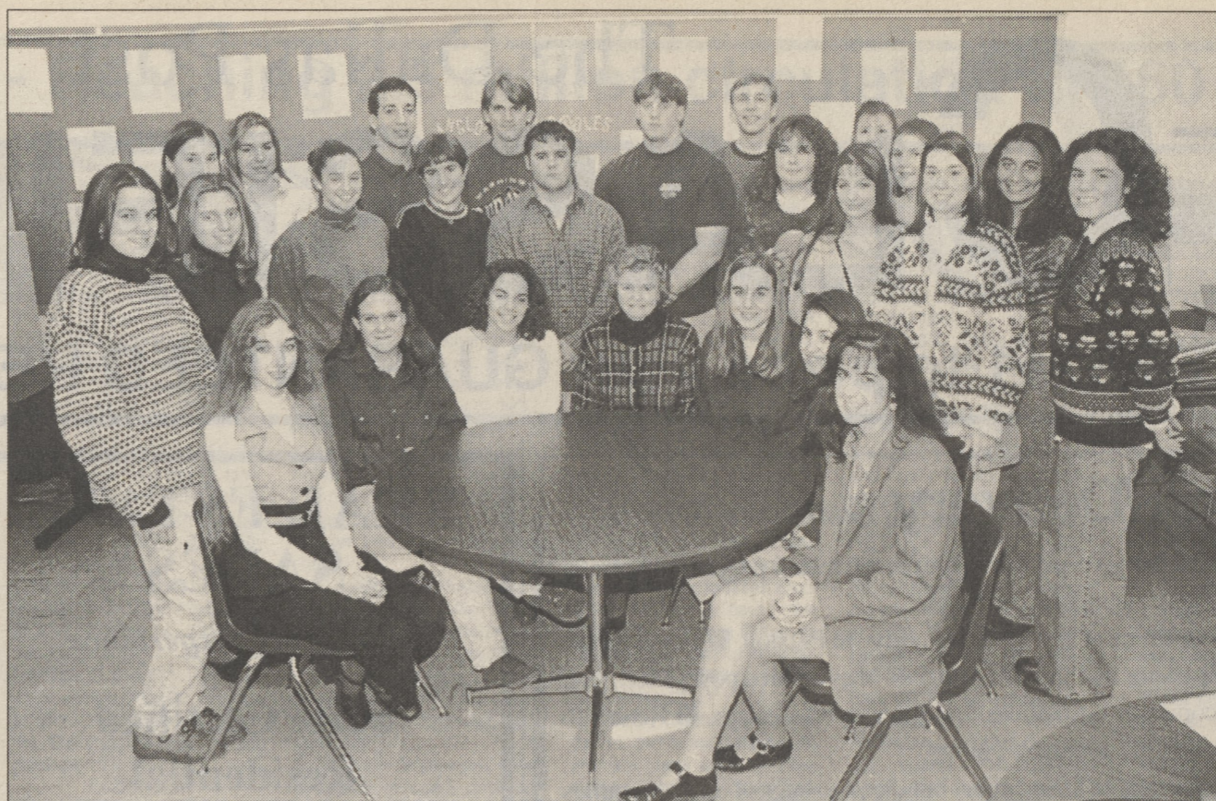

Kindergarten registration starts Mar. 17

Dr. Gilbert R. Griffiths, Acting Superintendent of the Dallas School District, announces Kindergarten Registration for the 1997-98 school year will be held in the Dallas Administrative Office Building, Church St., Dallas on March 17, 18, 19 and 20. Hours will be from 9 a.m. to 11 a.m. and 1 p.m. to 4 p.m., Monday through Thursday. A Birth Certificate or other acceptable evidence of age must accompany each registration. A child must be five years of age on or before September 30, 1997 to make him/her eligible for Kindergarten.

Those with last names beginning with A, B, C, D and E will register on Monday, March 17; those with F, G, H, I and J on Tuesday, March 18; those with K, L, M, N, O, P, Q and R on Wednesday, March 19; and those with S, T, U, V, W, X, Y and

Z on Thursday, March 20. The children who will enter first grade but did not attend the Dallas Kindergarten program this past term, may register on Thursday, March 20.

In addition to the registration, vision and speech screenings will be given. Hearing screenings are available if requested.

New Pennsylvania immunization regulations require students entering school for the first time to have proof of three doses of Hepatitis B given at intervals recommended by a physician.

The school officials need to review the child's immunizations to be certain the child meets the standards as set by the state regarding immunizations. If the student's records do not meet the standards, he/she will not be able to attend school.

PSU offers computer workshops

Penn State Wilkes-Barre begins its Spring '97 series of micro-computer workshops on March 10. The workshops offer hands-on skill training for all levels of computer literacy, from introduction to PC computing for the computer novice to programming in Visual Basic for the power PC user.

Both Windows 3.1 and Windows '95 platforms will be featured. Software applications include Word, Excel, Access, Powerpoint and WordPerfect. Introductory, intermediate and advanced levels of most software applications accommodate a variety of skill levels and training needs.

A series of Internet workshops

on Monday evenings allows participants to choose among several Internet skills.

New this spring is a 24-credit certificate program based on computer skills called the "Management Information Systems Certificate." Program courses emphasize the use of computers as tools for providing information for effective decision making and increased productivity.
