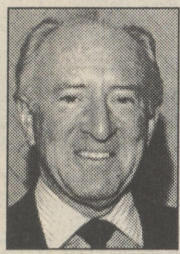


MOVERS AND SHAKERS

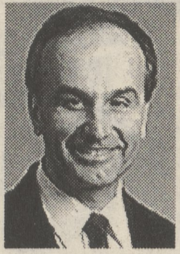
