Dr. Barbara Price of Shavertown, director of career planning and placement and Joan Bush of Dallas, took part in planning the fair.

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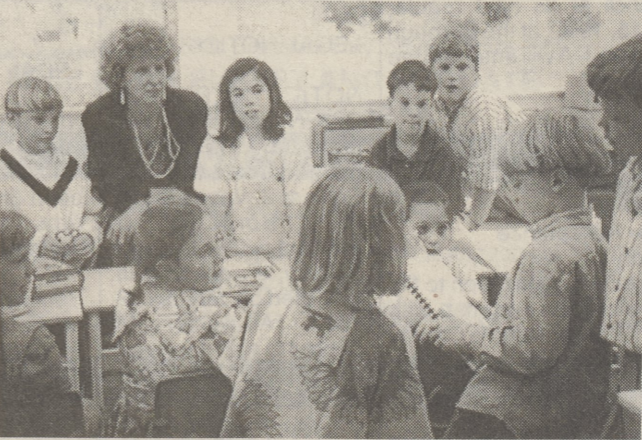
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
