we have been given the grant," Glogowski said. "It will go a long way in helping us work on roads that were not a priority to the township. That part of the township will be pretty much up to snuff."

In other road repair news, the township voted unanimously to authorize the township secretary to advertise for bids for three proposed road surfacing projects. Being considered for resurfacing are Oldfield Road, Worthington Road, and Sheffield Road.

Glogowski said the township is only looking at costs for the work, not committing to the repair. Wilkes explained that once the township has an idea of cost, he will then be able to determine if the repairs are within the budget.

The board also voted to appoint new members to several township committee positions left vacant by recent resignations. Walter Billings was appointed to the Planning Committee. Diane Gallagher was selected for the Citizens Advisory Board and Bob Seeley was appointed to the Recreation Board.

Township Solicitor Blythe Evans said the township's court injunction against American Asphalt will begin again April 16. The township alleges the asphalt

company has been mining 800 feet outside the mining zone. The current lawsuit went to court in January 1997.

Township resident Fred Murray questioned the board once again about removal of contaminated soil from township property that took place in 1992. Murray questioned conflicting numbers that turned up in newspaper reports and township records as to the amount of soil removed and the cost of removal. Glogowski told Murray that he is unable to control what someone writes in a newspaper.

In response to Murray's request for a public hearing regarding the removal, Glogowski said, "I'm just as tight with a nickel as you are, Mr. Murray. I still don't believe the township did anything wrong. We did everything in compliance with the law. Everything was done at public meetings."

Richard Rusnok, club president, has announced that fellow Parent Club members will be in attendance to discuss the benefits of the networking and support that exists among Academy families.

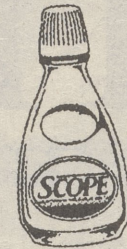
