# Magic show will bring illusions to life

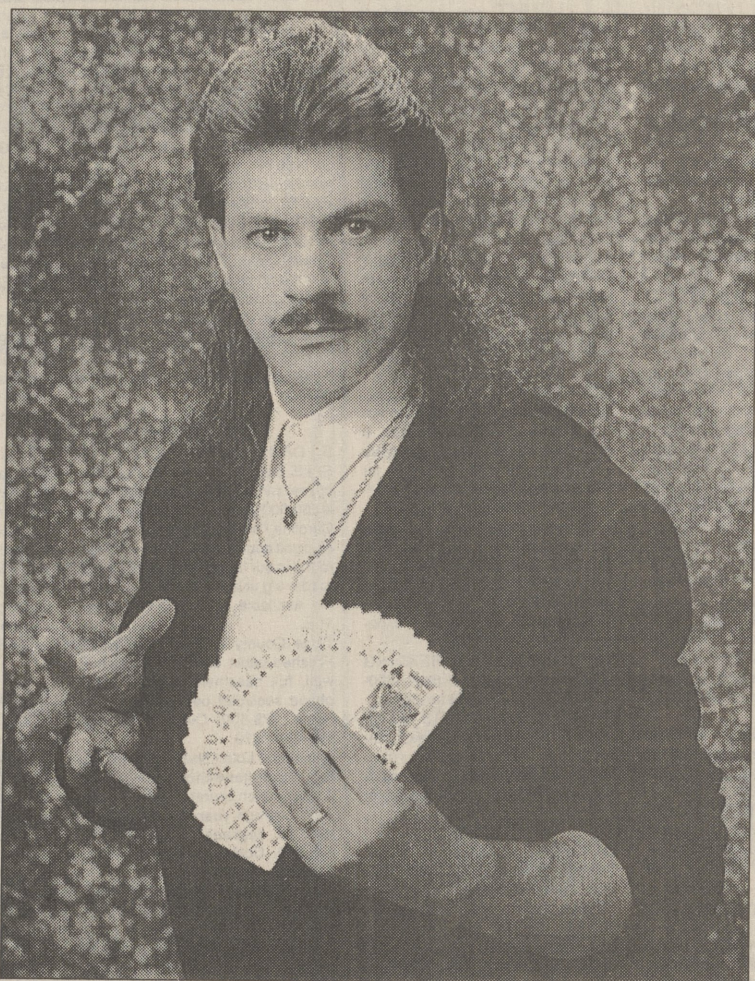

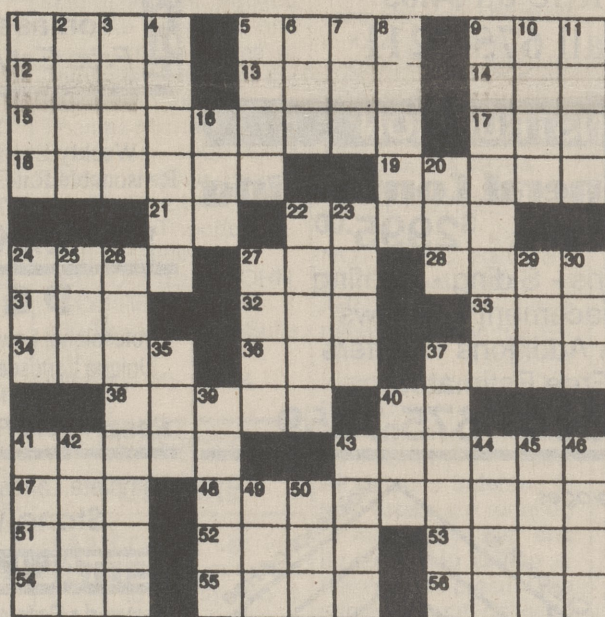
