The speaker will be Cathy Lashford whose topic will be "Celebrate United Methodist Women". This year is the 25th Anniversary of United Methodist Women.



Dan Fetko aimed for the hoop during gym period at Dallas Middle School. Guarding him were Joe Rogers, left, and Stehan Stolarick.


Gialanella makes dean's list at Gannon
