DALLAS TWP. - A bookstore has recently materialized on Rt. 415 in the township. Kokopelli opened just three weeks ago, offering a wide variety of "mystical" books. Owner Diane Hoover said she had dreamed of opening the store for years. "It's something I've always wanted to do," she said in a quiet voice.

Now, if the word mystical makes you think of voodoo and witchy brews, this isn't the store for you. To Hoover, "mystical" is the best word to describe the books that represent the spirituality of their subjects and authors. "I really think these books mean something," she explained as one of the reasons she wanted to open the shop.

Kokopelli offers everything from

award-winning children's books and Native American writings to entire sections on homeopathic remedies and Angels. Popular titles such as *Celestine Prophecy*, by James Redfield and *Chicken Soup for the Soul*, by Jack Canfield and Mark Victor Hanson also can be found among the shelves.

Hoover named the store after the Native American flute player who represents abundance. Abundance is an accurate description for this well-stocked store.

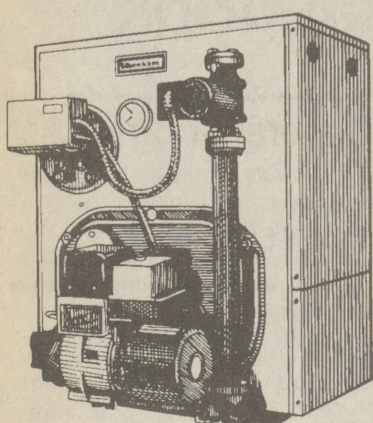
I have been a conscientious and dedicated supervisor for the past three years, that is why I am now asking for the opportunity to serve Kingston Township for another four years.

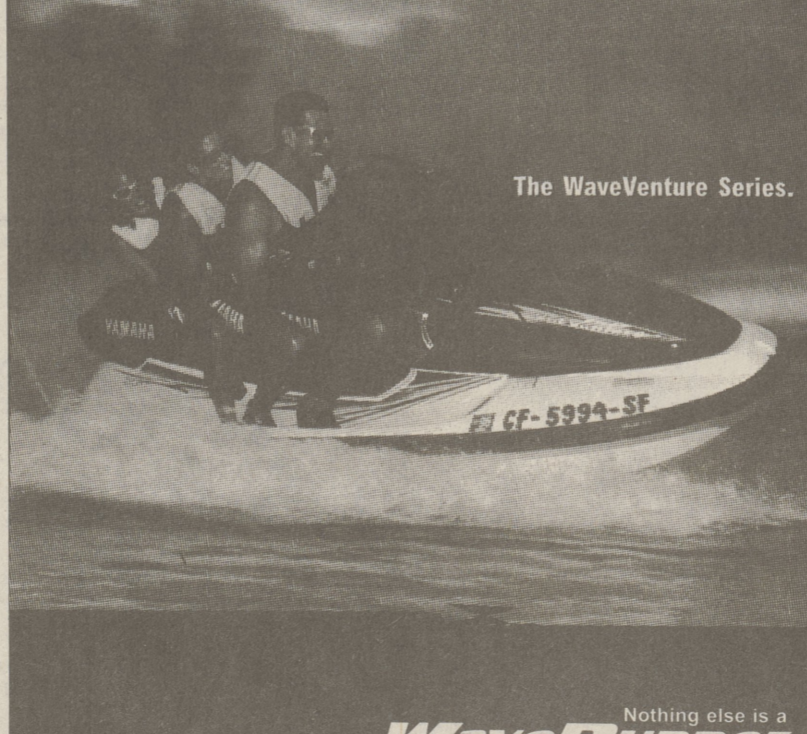
