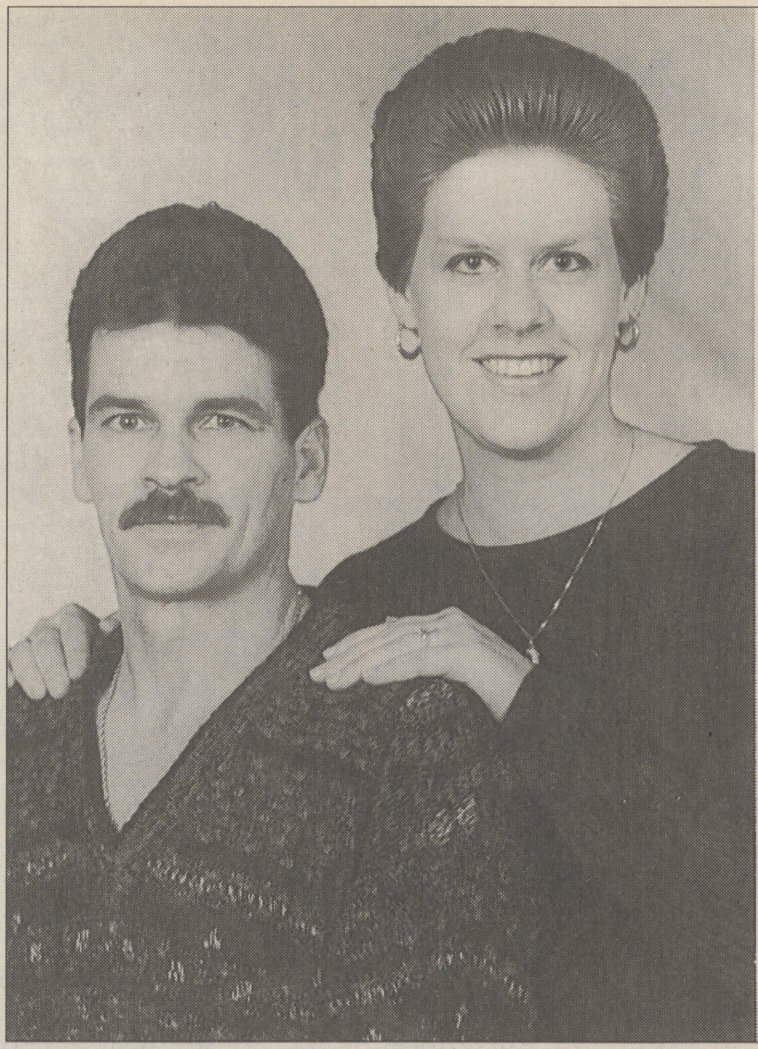
'Festival of Faith' is coming May 18

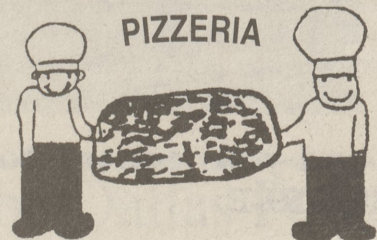
