## Brooks named outstanding female athlete at Wilkes

Noell Ann Brooks, Lehman, former Lake-Lehman standout in field hockey and softball, recently was named Female Athlete of the Year at Wilkes University. She was captain of the field hockey team, named MVP of Mid-Atlantic Conference, Freedom League-1996, first time a defensive player was honored for this award.

A four year starter in field hockey, she was named to the National Field Hockey Coaches Association third team All American squad in 1996, she also was second team regional All American in 1995.

She was a member of a defensive unit that allowed just 23 goals and recorded four shutouts in 20 games during the 1996 season. Wilkes University won its fourth straight Mac Freedom League title and its third ECAC Mid-Atlantic championship in the last four years.

A senior biology major, she is a three time member of the Mac Fall Academic team and a 1996 member of Div. III National Academic team, recipient of the Alfred Franklin D'Anca M.D. Scholarship 96-97, awarded for academic

ability and leadership qualities, recipient of 1997 Biology Research Award at Wilkes.

She will attend graduate school at the University of Pittsburgh School of Dental Medicine in the fall. She is the daughter of Ronald and Patricia Brooks, Lehman.

Another boating course is scheduled and will be held at the Pennsylvania Game Commission's Northeast Regional Office, Rt. 415, Dallas.

The course will be held on Sun., May 18, from 9 a.m.-5 p.m. Lunch will not be provided. A lunch break will be given around noon time. Those attending will have to make their own arrangement for their lunch. There are many eating establishments in the immediate area or bring a box lunch.

The course will acquaint experienced boaters with many aspects of boating they are not

aware of as well as changes in current regulations. The course is open to everyone 12 years of age and older. This course will allow individuals 12 to 15 years of age to satisfy the mandatory minimum age requirements for the operation of a motorboat (including personal watercraft) in Pennsylvania. We strongly recommend parents take the course along with their children.
