Born in Wilkes-Barre, she graduated from St. Ann's Academy and studied voice and piano with Adolph Hansen. She attended the Curtis Insti-


tute of Music, Philadelphia, and did considerable concert and oratorical work. She was past president of both the Mozart Club and the Quota
