Theatre-on-the-Green presents *Othello*

College Misericordia will celebrate the 10th anniversary of Theatre-on-the-Green with the presentation of Shakespeare's *Othello*. The classic tragedy of the fall of a great man is a departure from the comedies that have been a tradition for Theatre-on-the-Green. Former members of the National Players, professional actors from the Washington, D.C. area, will perform on the outdoor stage under the direction of Jim Petosa.

Othello is a romantic tragedy that depicts the struggle between good and evil.

Petosa set the play in a 20th Century totalitarian state, a world the audience recognizes, to help the audience become engaged in the story. Othello is the outsider who is a respected warrior and statesman; Iago, whom Othello passes over for promotion, is pure villain, motivated by jealousy and anger to plot Othello's downfall.

The production will be held July 11, 12 and 13 at 8 p.m. on Misericordia's scenic outdoor stage. Tickets are now on sale and are \$8 for bleacher and

chair seating, \$4 for lawn seating and \$50 for tables of four. An opening night performance on Thursday night, July 10 is

to provide insight into the play, its characters and the playwright himself. The symposium is free and open to the public.

Shakespeare For Children, an interactive theatre workshop for elementary school children, will be held on Fri., July 11.

A theatre workshop and a production assistant program for high school and college students will begin on July 7.

The theatre workshop is open to students in junior and senior high school.

The production assistant program allows senior high school and college students to learn stage and lighting techniques while working with the professional cast and crew of the production, training in state movement, voice and acting.

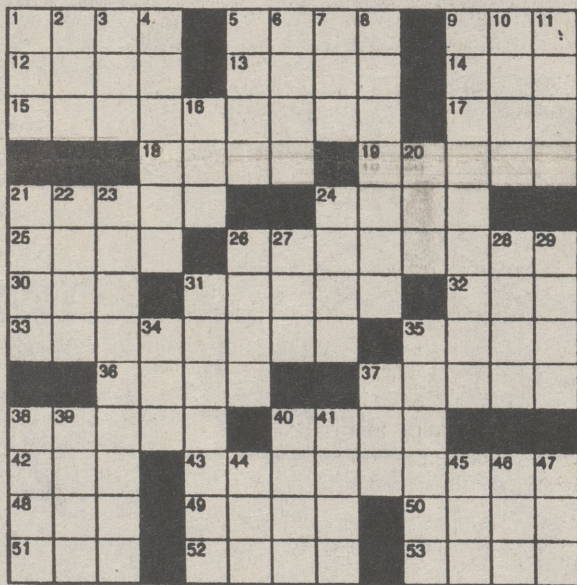

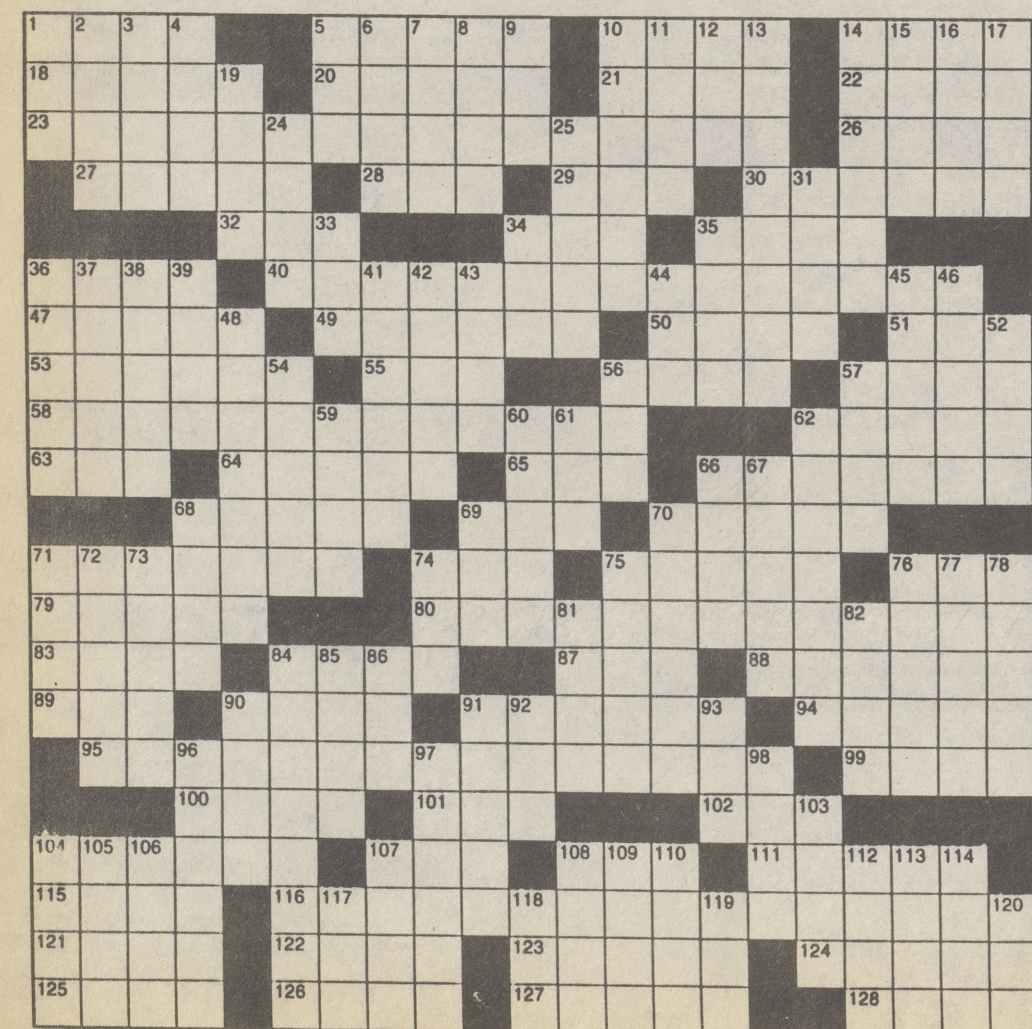
