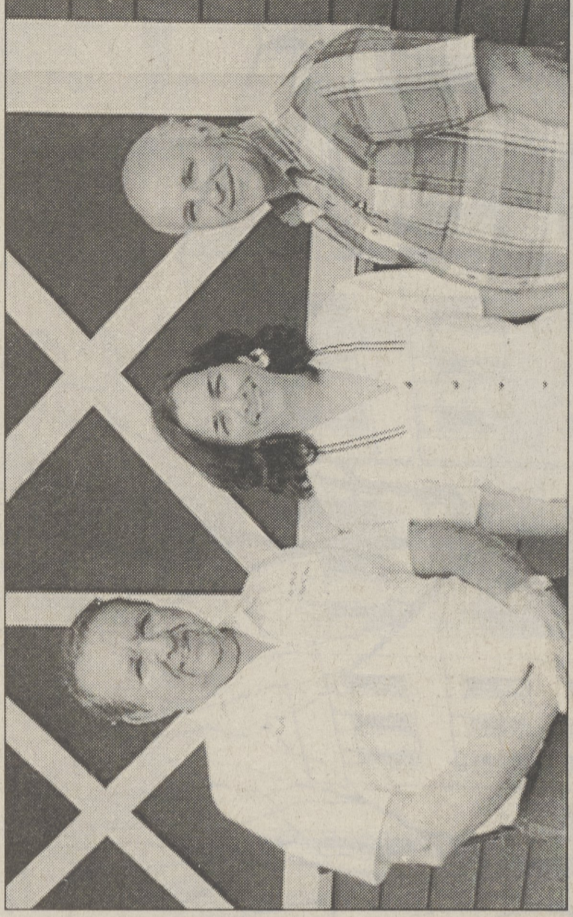
positive, said Schmoll. A good-sized billboard will be present at the food booth will all 24 businesses listed.

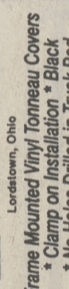

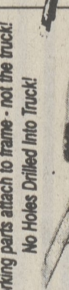

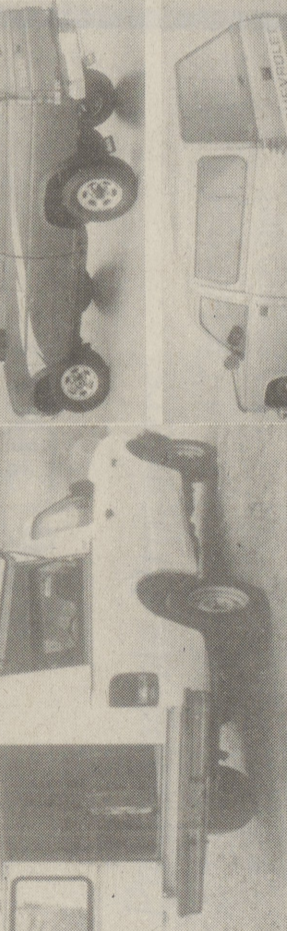
