LEHMAN- With a grueling competition season looming ahead, the Lake-Lehman High School marching band commenced their annual "band camp" last week, working through Saturday in order to put their 1997 field show

This year's show features music from "Riverdance." "We're trying to expand both musically and visually from what we did last year," said band director Edward A. Richards. The music for the show covers a variety of different themes, from Irish style ballads and Spanish segments to North American pieces.

Selections include; "Moon Harvest," "Nova Scotia," "Home in the Heartland," "Fire Dance," and "Riverdance Finale. According to Richards "The music has a Celtic flavor to it, and we want to demonstrate the influence of Celtic music throughout the world."





Army National Guard Pvt. Joshua P. Chollak has entered basic military training at Fort Sill, Lawton, OK.


