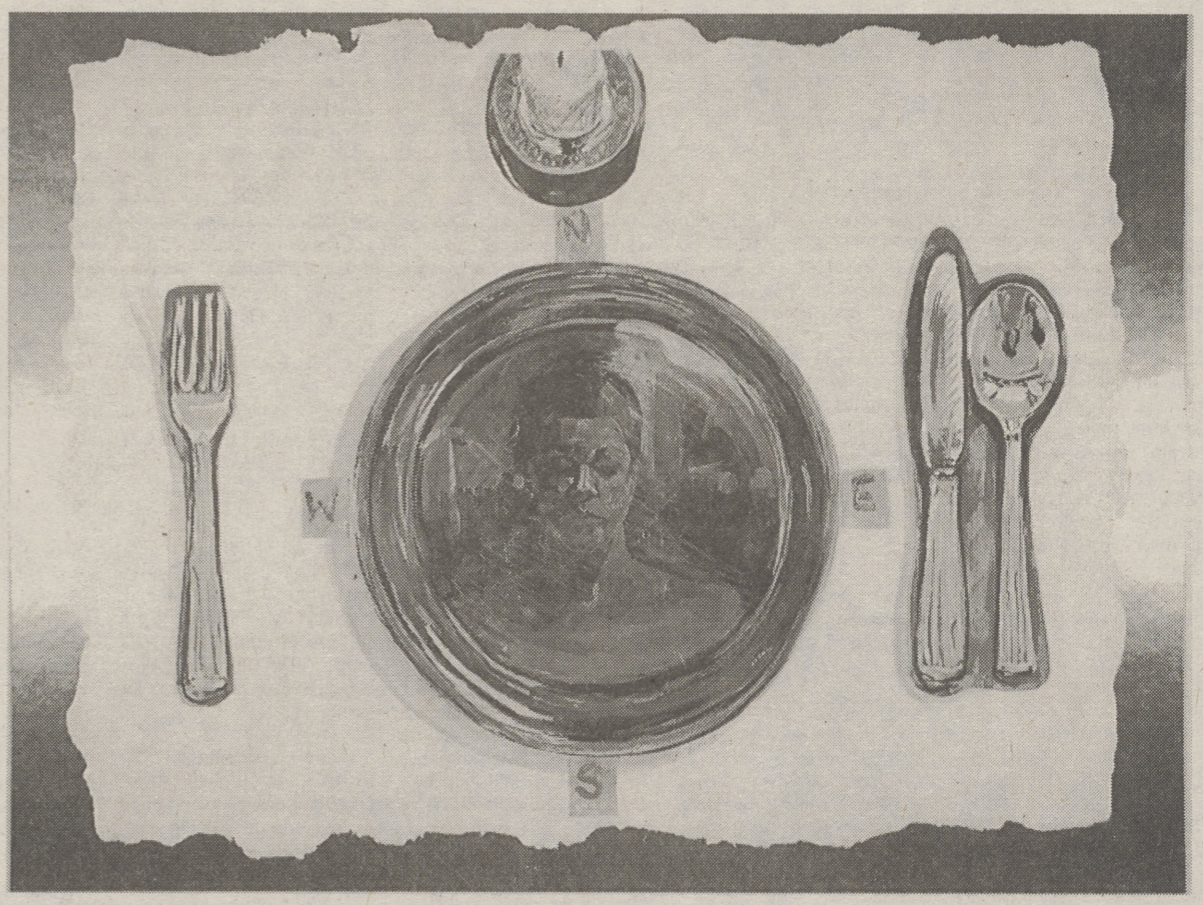

Leigh Pawling's art chosen for New York exhibition
