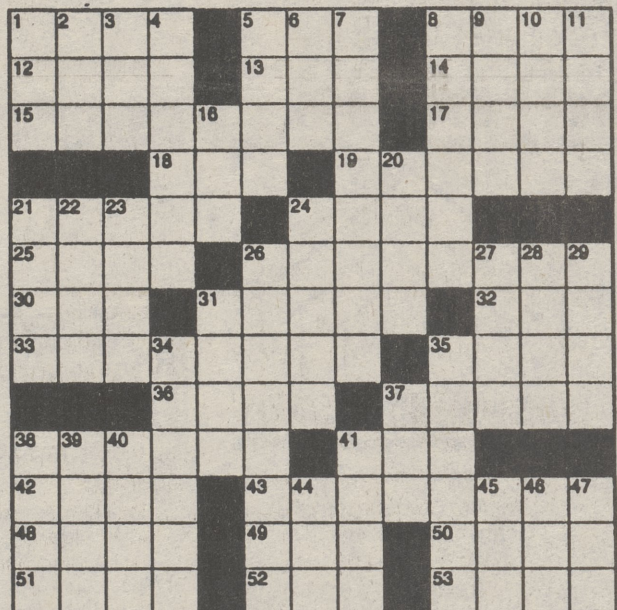

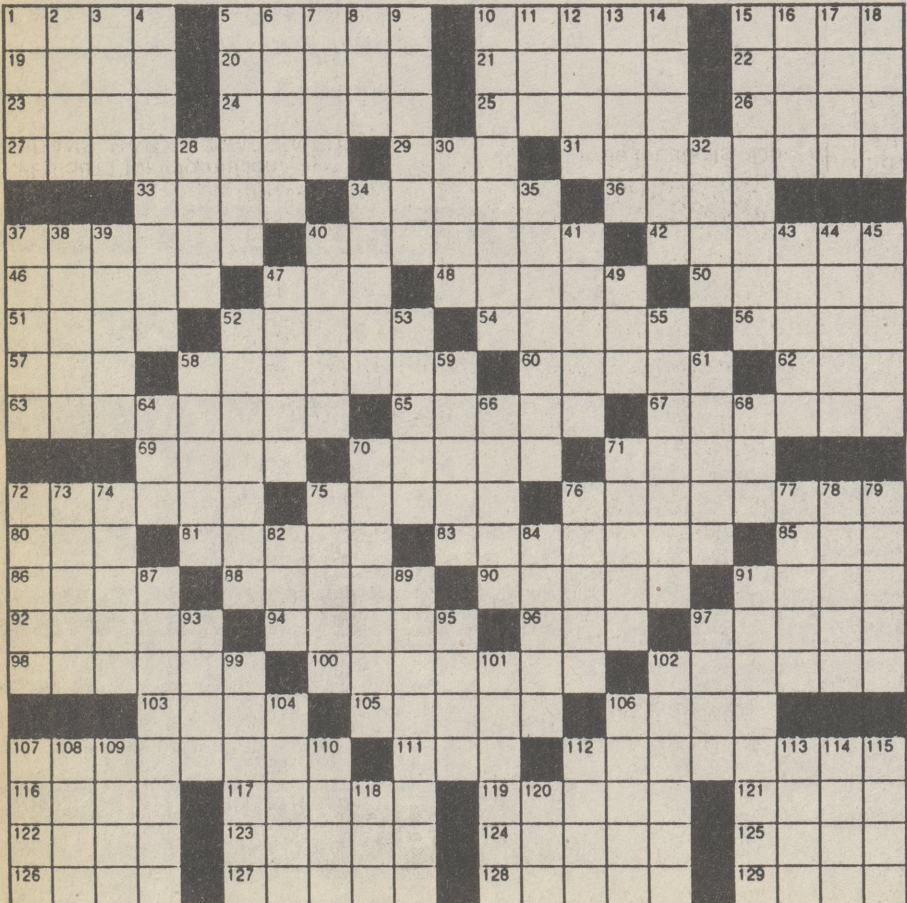
Challenger THE INTERNATIONAL CROSSNUMBER GAME
