

Greco has paid off sewer bill

Concert promoter Thom Greco has paid nearly all his bill with the Harveys Lake Municipal Authority, and a lien on the amphitheater he built on land leased from Shirley Hanson will probably be lifted this week.

"He has all but satisfied the lien," said Rick Boice, municipal authority manager. The lien became an issue when it was reported last week that Hanson is trying to sell the property, the former Hanson's Amusement Park, but is hampered by the restriction.

Boice, who also serves as mayor of Harveys Lake Borough, said he knew of no other outstanding bills with the borough. Greco paid for

added police coverage the first few years the amphitheater operated, but Boice said the last couple of years borough officers did not enter the grounds.
