

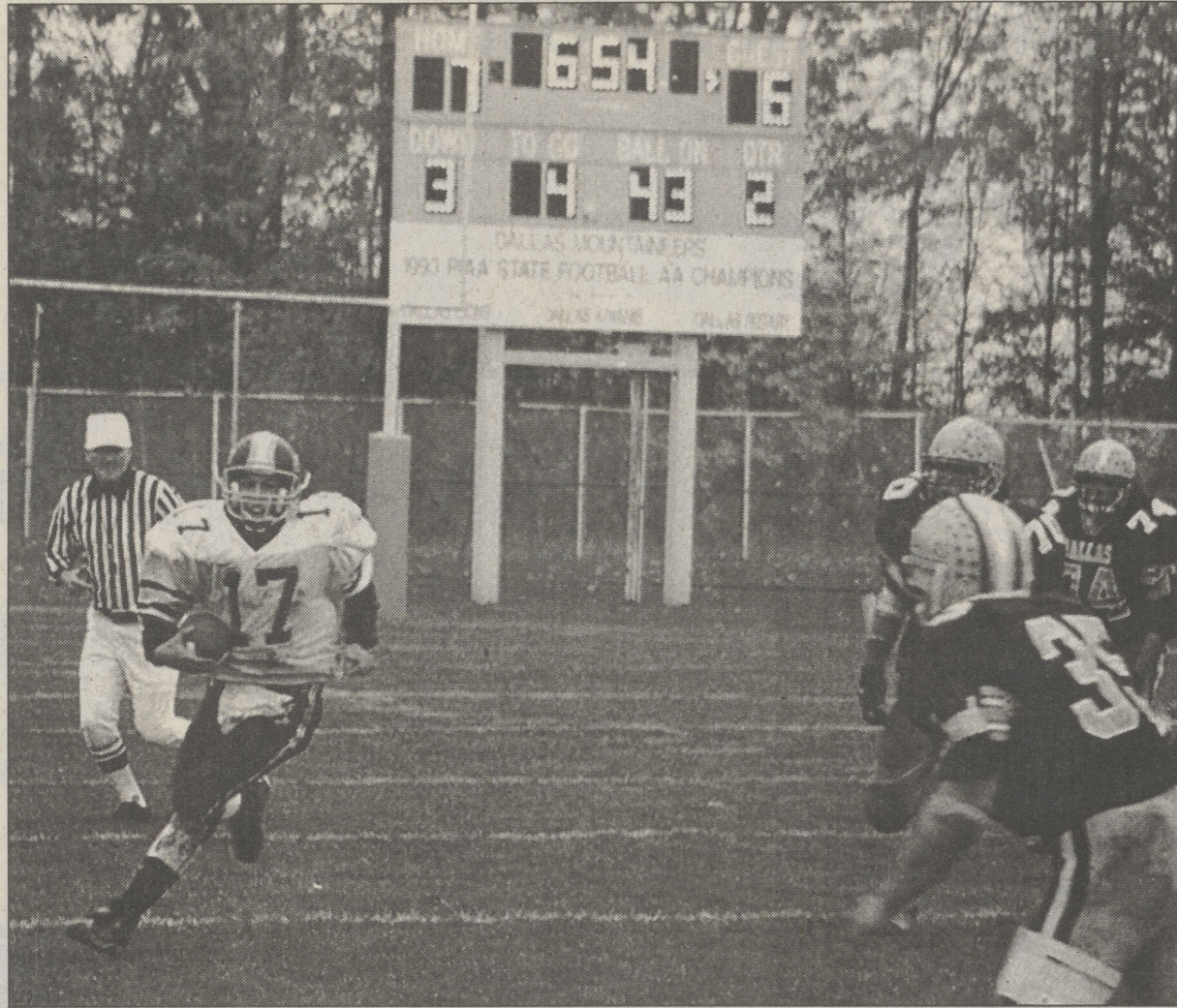

He said passing might be a factor in the rematch, with the Mounts taking to the air more than they have so far this season. Quarterback Bill Piasta threw only one pass Saturday, but that resulted in a 37-yard touchdown to Eric White.

Jackson, who is a GAR graduate, has strong feelings about recent events at his alma mater. "I used to always root for GAR, except against us," he said. "But I can't any more. I'm rooting for Lehman."

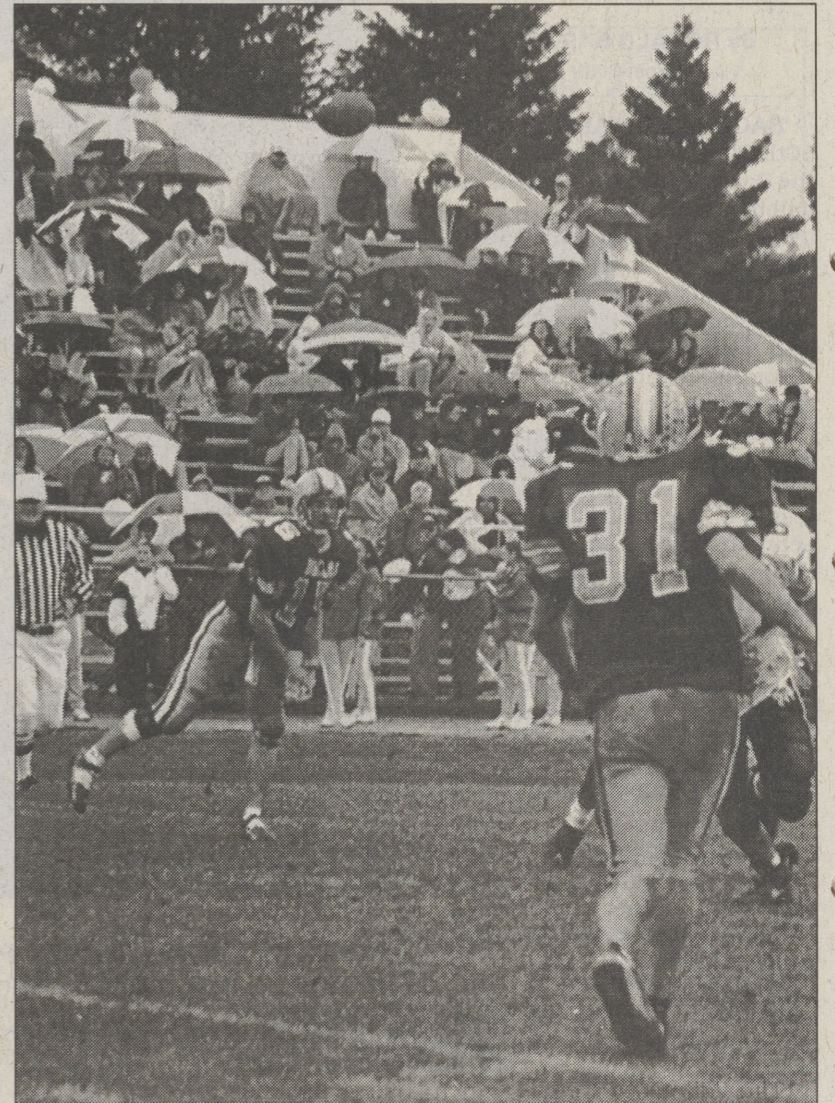
