**Alzheimer's Assoc. to hold program**

On Sat., Nov. 15, the Northeast Pennsylvania Chapter of the Alzheimer's Association and Tyler Memorial Hospital will conduct a three-hour training program for family members who are caring for loved ones suffering from dementia caused by Alzheimer's or other related diseases. Beginning at 1 p.m. in the Hospital's Blue Room, the program will consist of a series of five video tapes that cover some of the most challenging issues of caregiving. 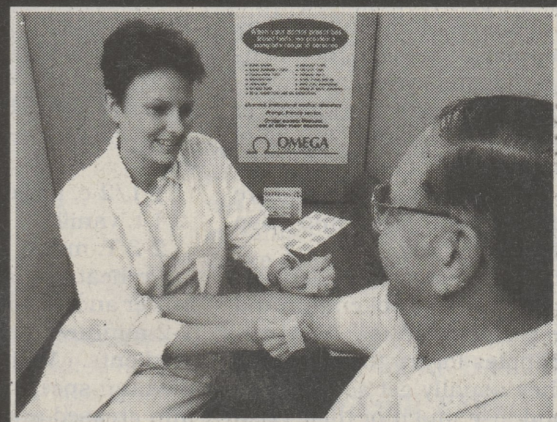
