tomers stand right behind him. On May 29 and May 30 he went to his neighbors' homes, recorded their pressures between 7 and 9 p.m. and got their signed support. The recorded numbers ranged from 23 to 35 psi.

"No one refused to sign the petition," said Kopcho. The petition was turned in to the PUC. Pack said United Water has not received the petition.

Pack said, "Our company understands where Kopcho is coming from. We are looking into long-term solutions. We would like them (Westminster Dr. residents) to have pressures they are satisfied with. We are looking for alternatives." Pack said larger booster stations are an option, but would most likely be built once the area above Westminster started being developed. "I'm not sure where we'll go. If indeed we do something, we'll do something that benefits the larger part of the


Mary Blanc, who has lived on Westminster Dr. for four years, said she has never lived anywhere with such poor water pressure. "We have to be careful not to use too much at one time," she said. But, water pressure is the lesser of her concerns.

"I'm more concerned with the number of main breaks. They almost continuously have us under boil advisories that we're never told about. I highly question the quality of water," said Blanc, who buys bottled water for cooking and drinking. She said she supports Kopcho and was happy to sign the petition.

Pack said United Water uses radio, television and newspapers to inform people of boil advisories. "I think as a utility we are very responsible as far as advisories go," he said.

John Gregorski has lived on the street for 28 years and said he has lived with low water pressure the entire time. "I think it's a most preposterous suggestion given the level of service," said Gregorski of the proposed rate increase. "This The shower process is rather tedious because there isn't much

Kopcho will take part in a telephone hearing on Dec. 2 with PUC administrative judge Richard Lovenwirth. Both Kopcho and United Water have retained legal representation.
