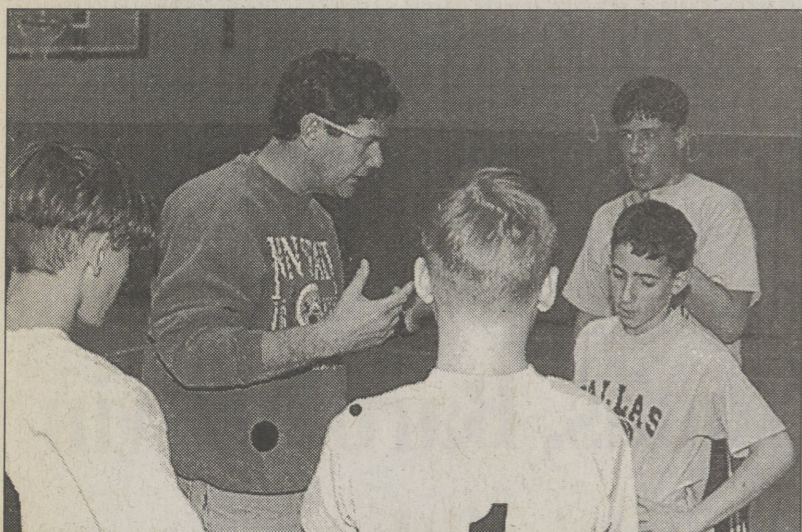

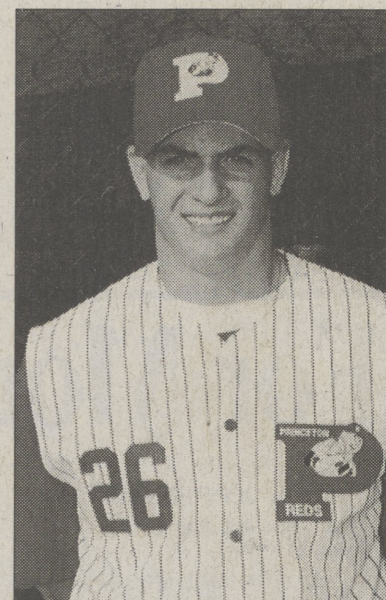


Baseball clinic features Oliver other coaches
